

- Full or part-time regional career centers



What is CTE?

- Set of courses and experiences that help students gain the technical skills and knowledge, academic foundation and realworld experience for high-skill, high-demand, high-wage careers
- Key state resource for contextualized learning
- Prepares students for college and career

Making Strong CTE/Early College Connections





Parameters to Consider

- Focus on areas where career pathways are being developed (state-wide curriculum)
 - Health Science -
 - Therapeutic Services (Practical Nursing, RN)
 - Diagnostic Services (Radiographic Tech, etc...)
 - Advanced Manufacturing
 - Mechatronics
 - Engineering
 - Construction Management





Parameters to Consider

- Average Hourly Rate of target occupations
- Highest projected openings (LMI)
- Require high school and CTE partnerships
 - Ensure curriculum alignment
 - Ensure college and career counseling in place
 - Ensure fiscal prioritization and credit granting



Parameters to Consider

- State-wide approach vs. center to center
- Implications for current funding system(s)
- How will we know this is successful?
 - Reduced time to degree completion?
 - Higher persistence rates?
 - Increased 6 month/3 year follow-up "employed in related area" responses
 - Reduced student loan debt?





Avoiding Unintended Consequences

- Avoid the financial "double-dip" of CTE entitlement & participation in EC
- Will adults without diplomas participating in CTE be allowed to participate?
- How will the effort be sustained beyond this initial effort?
- How will a successful effort be expanded to ensure equity?
