I come from a town that is impoverished, with not many residents going to college. I'm the first in my family to ever attend college, and in May, I will be the first to receive a Bachelor's degree. That being said, my family didn't have the money to provide an education for me. Thus, I had to work and pay for it myself. I worked through the entirety of high school, thirty hours a week, and forty in the summers. This instilled good work ethic in me, but also limited my opportunities in high school. After high school, I had enough to pay for a year of college with a substantial amount of loans. Since being in college, I've picked up two additional part time jobs along with a full schedule. It supplemented my out of pocket expenses for the first two years. However, in my third year, I did not have enough to cover the costs after loans, so I had to apply for an additional private loan. I've made several compromises in order to cover the cost of tuition. At twenty-two years old, I've still never owned a car or gotten my license, because I knew I wouldn't be able to afford tuition, car payments, and insurance. With my Pell Grant and an honors scholarship, I'm simply scraping by, but I know many people who weren't lucky enough, ran out of money, and were forced to leave the institution.
