## Policy Research Assistance for 2019 Legislative Session

The **Vermont Legislative Research Service** (VLRS) is taking requests from legislators for policy research during the 2019 session. The VLRS operates several student research teams to answer your policy questions working directly under the supervision of University of Vermont Political Science Professor Anthony "Jack" Gierzynski (VLRS Director and Chair of the Political Science Department). The VLRS exists to provide nonpartisan information for legislators on issues before the legislature.

## What can we do for you?

The types of research requests we should be able to fill include:

- investigations into practices and programs in other states (through the Web, the National Conference of State Legislators (NCSL), and phone contact with other state officials);
- reports summarizing the latest academic studies on a particular topic;
- information on federal programs and grants;
- and, information regarding the state of Vermont.
