Subject: Bill H.513 and 5G antennas

Dear Members of the Senate Finance Committee and Senate Committee on Health and Welfare,

You need to understand about Bill H.513: The way this bill is currently written 5G is concealed inside the term "broadband" and you may not understand this.

1. PLEASE AMEND THE LANGUAGE IN BILL H.513 SECTIONS 19A (1) AND (2) BECAUSE THEY ALLOW 5G TO BE IMPLEMENTED UNDER THE COVER OF BROADBAND EXPANSION CALLED "ONE-TOUCH-MAKE-READY."

2. PLACE A STAY ON THE ATTACHMENT OF 5G ANTENNAS TO POLES AND TOWERS UNTIL PROVEN SAFE AND RELIABLE, INCLUDING 4G ANTENNAS THAT CAN BE UPGRADED TO 5G VIA SOFTWARE.
