Hello, honorable legislators,

As a Vermont voter, I am called to remind you that the very first sentence of the state constitution affirms our right to SAFETY. Your job as elected official centers around maintaining and assuring the unalienable (meaning not for sale or trade) rights to life and safety. H513 threatens both life and safety.

Please table the bill until independent studies can guarantee health and safety in the face of increasing wireless radiofrequency radiation from 4G to 5G or other iterations of wireless microwave technology.

Vermont's health and safety is too precious to risk on unknown technology experiments. People, including children, are dying of cancer at increased rates since wireless has become popular and common.

Your job is to protect people, not business interests. Vermont can survive without 5G and maintain the convenience of current technology tools by using the FIBER OPTICS OPTION, "to the last mile", that was paid to AT&T and Verizon several years ago.
