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Summary of the Finance-Related Provisions of S.233 As Recommended by Senate Gov Ops

An act relating to uniform licensing standards

Prepared for the Senate Committee on Finance See also this overall summary

Applicable professional regulatory entities. This bill applies to the following State professional regulatory entities:

- Office of Professional Regulation;
- Department of Environmental Conservation (for well drillers);
- Standards Board for Professional Educators;
- Electricians' Licensing Board;
- Board of Medical Practice; and
- Plumbers' Examining Board.

Uniform licensing standards. To summarize, the bill requires those professional regulatory entities to have uniform licensing standards in the following areas:

- *Military credentials; fees.* Evaluating military credentials and waiving application fees for qualified military members and spouses.
- *Criminal background*. Pre-application determinations regarding a potential applicant's criminal background.
- *Sunset review*. Periodic sunset reviews of the entity's continuing competency requirements.
- *Endorsement from other states*. Licensure by endorsement from other states based on three years of practice in good standing.
- Foreign credential verification. A process for foreign credential verification.

Effect on State revenue. The portions of the bill affecting the revenues of the State are as follows:

- *Military fees.* The bill requires the entity to determine qualifications and procedures by which the entity "shall, upon request, waive application fees to qualified military members and military spouses." *See*:

- *Criminal backgrounds*. The bill requires each entity to provide a pre-application determination of an individual's criminal background (a.k.a. a "second chance" determination request). For each entity, the individual seeking this determination would pay a fee of \$25, which would be deducted from the license application fee if the applicant thereafter applied for licensure. *See*:
