4	(a) The Office of Professional Regulation, the Agency of Education, the
5	Agency of Human Services, the Agency of Natural Resources, the Department
6	of Public Safety, and the Department of Health shall identify direct license
7	equivalents, if any, to credentials issued by Canadian federal and provincial
8	licensing bodies for professions licensed under the entity's authority and
9	propose bridge-to-licensure programs where supplemental effort is needed to
10	meet Vermont's licensing criteria.
11	(b) The Office of Professional Regulation shall collaborate with the other
12	agencies and departments specified in subsection (a) of this section in order to
13	submit on or before October 15, 2019 a unified report that includes any
14	recommended changes to statute to the Senate and House Committees on
15	Government Operations, the Senate Committee on Economic Development,
16	Housing and General Affairs, and the House Committee on Commerce and
17	Economic Development.
