AN ACT IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION TWELVE OF CHAPTER ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SIX, OF THE GENERAL STATUTES.

SECTION 1. Section twelve of chapter one hundred twenty-six of the General Statutes, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

The annual salaries of the judges of probate in the district of Lamoille shall be four hundred dollars; in the district of Rutland eight hundred dollars.

Salaries of judges of probate in districts of Lamoille and Rutland.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of December next.

AN ACT IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION THIRTY-TWO OF CHAPTER SIXTEEN OF THE GENERAL STATUTES, ENTITLED "OF THE ORGANIZATION OF VILLAGE CORPORATIONS AND FIRE DISTRICTS."

SECTION 1. Section thirty-two of chapter sixteen of the General Statutes, shall be amended by adding thereto the following:—

"Provided, that the polls of no members of fire companies shall be exempt from taxation, except by a vote of the town in which such members reside, given at the annual March meeting of said town in each year, previous to such exemption."

Polls of members of fire companies shall not be exempt from taxation except by vote of town.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.

AN ACT DEFINING WHO SHALL BE VOTERS IN TOWN, VILLAGE, CITY, AND SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETINGS.

SECTION

1. No person allowed to vote unless he be a citizen of this state, and a resident of the town, &c.

SECTION

2. The word "citizen" construed.
3. Act takes effect from its passage.

SECTION 1. No person shall be entitled to vote in any town, city, village, or school district meeting, who is not a citizen of this state, and a resident of the town, city, village, or school district where said person may claim a right to vote.

No person allowed to vote unless he be a citizen of this state, and a resident of the town, &c.

SECT. 2. The word "citizen," as used in this act, shall be construed to mean a person born within this, or some one of the United States, or naturalized agreeably to the acts of congress, or a person who has become a freeman of this state, by virtue of the laws in force before June 26th, 1828.

The word "citizen" construed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from its passage.
