8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: In response to COVID-19, this bill
9	proposes to:
10	(1) eliminate the requirement that emergency medical personnel be
11	credentialed by their affiliated agency;
12	(2) extend ambulance license terms from one to three years;
13	(3) require the Department of Financial Regulation to enforce the
14	current law requirement for health insurers to directly reimburse ambulance
15	services for the emergency medical treatment they provide;
16	(4) provide a temporary extension for electrician and plumber license
17	renewal; and
18	(5) allow a county's reserve funds to be used for the sheriff's emergency
19	needs relating to COVID-19.

10	(a) It shall be the function of each emergency medical services district to
11	foster and coordinate emergency medical services within the district, in the

13	emergency medical services district shall have powers which that include the

9	§ 2682. POWERS OF STATE BOARD
10	(a) The State Board shall administer this subchapter and shall have power
11	to:

13	(3) Make, adopt, amend, and revise, as it deems necessary or expedient,
14	reasonable rules in order to promote and protect the health, safety, and welfare
15	of members of the public using, served by, or in need of emergency medical

2	Full licenses shall be issued on forms to be prescribed by the State Board
3	for a period of one year three years beginning on January 1, or for the balance
4	of any such year three-year period. Temporary, conditional, or provisional
5	licenses may also be issued by the Board.

7	§ 2689. REIMBURSEMENT FOR AMBULANCE SERVICE PROVIDERS
8	(a)(1) When an ambulance service provides emergency medical treatment
9	to a person who is insured by a health insurance policy, plan, or contract that
10	provides benefits for emergency medical treatment, the health insurer shall
11	reimburse the ambulance service directly, subject to the terms and conditions
12	of the health insurance policy, plan, or contract.

16	or injury, and to alleviate suffering.
17	(1) The system should include competent emergency medical $\frac{1}{1}$
18	treatment provided by adequately trained, licensed, credentialed, and equipped
19	personnel acting under appropriate medical control.

1	(2) Persons involved in the delivery of emergency medical care should
2	be encouraged to maintain and advance their levels of training and licensure,
3	and to upgrade the quality of their vehicles and equipment.

5	§ 903. AUTHORIZATION FOR PROVISION OF EMERGENCY
6	MEDICAL SERVICES
7	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, including provisions of
8	26 V.S.A. chapter 23, persons who are licensed and credentialed to provide
9	emergency medical care treatment pursuant to the requirements of this chapter
10	and implementing regulations the rules adopted under it are hereby authorized
11	to provide such care without further certification, registration, or licensing.

14	RESPONSIBILITIES
15	To implement the policy of section 901 of this title chapter, the Department

The rules shall also provide that:

(B) An individual licensed by the Commissioner as an emergency
medical technician, advanced emergency medical technician, or a paramedic,
who is credentialed by an affiliated agency, shall be able to practice fully
within the scope of practice for such level of licensure as defined by NHTSA's

2	(E) An applicant who has served as a hospital corpsman or a medic in
3	the U.S. Armed Forces, or who is licensed as a registered nurse or a physician
4	assistant shall be granted a permanent waiver of the training requirements to
5	become a licensed emergency medical technician, an advanced emergency
6	medical technician, or a paramedic, provided the applicant passes the
7	applicable examination approved by the Commissioner for that level of
8	licensure and further provided that the applicant is credentialed by an affiliated
9	agency.
10	(F) An applicant who is registered on the National Registry of
11	Emergency Medical Technicians as an emergency medical technician, an
12	advanced emergency medical technician, or a paramedic shall be granted
13	licensure as a Vermont emergency medical technician, an advanced emergency

3	Sec. 4. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; ELECTRICIANS'

5	TEMPORARY LICENSE EXTENSION AND LATE FEE WAIVER
6	Notwithstanding the provisions of 26 V.S.A. §§ 908 (electricians) and 2195
7	(plumbers) regulating the renewal of licenses by the Electricians' Licensing
8	Board and Plumbers' Examining Board, all electrician and plumber licenses
9	that were due to expire between March 30, 2020 and September 30, 2020 shall
10	remain valid and be deemed to expire on September 30, 2020, and any
11	associated late fees for renewal that would have applied during that time frame
12	shall be waived.
13	Sec. 5. COVID-19 STATE OF EMERGENCY; COUNTY RESERVE

16	(a) Funding.
17	(1) To support the emergency needs of sheriffs due to the State's
18	COVID-19 response, a county's reserve funds described in 24 V.S.A. § 133(e)
19	shall be allowed to be used for the emergency needs of the county sheriff.
20	"Emergency needs" means the needs to respond to COVID-19 and includes

- 1 <u>hiring deputies, dispatchers, and other personnel and purchasing equipment</u>
- 2 <u>and supplies.</u>
- 3 (2) The funding of these emergency needs under this subsection shall be
- 4 in addition to the support of the sheriff's department set forth in 24 V.S.A.

- 6 (b) Application for FEMA reimbursement. Any sheriff who receives
- 7 <u>county reserve funds for emergency needs under subsection (a) of this section</u>
- 8 shall apply to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for any
- 9 <u>allowable reimbursement.</u>
- 10 (c) Sunset. This section shall be repealed two weeks after the day the
- 11 Governor terminates the state of emergency for the State of Vermont in
- 12 response to COVID-19.
