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1	TO THE HONORABLE SENATE
2	The Committee on Government Operations to which was referred Senate
3	Resolution 5 entitled "Senate resolution strongly opposing the basing of any
4	nuclear weapon delivery system in the State of Vermont" respectfully reports
5	that it has considered the same and recommends that the resolution be
6	amended by striking it out in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the
7	following:
8	Senate resolution strongly opposing the basing of any nuclear weapon
9	delivery system in Vermont.
10	Whereas, the State of Vermont has long been a national leader in opposing
11	the spread of nuclear weapons, and
12	Whereas, at Town Meeting in 1982, 88 percent of the 180 municipalities
13	voting on a U.S–U.S.S.R. bilateral nuclear freeze ballot measure voted in the
14	affirmative, and
15	Whereas, at Town Meeting in 1999, 33 Vermont municipalities voted to
16	"call upon the U.S. government and governments of all nuclear weapons states
17	to secure on an urgent basis a nuclear weapons abolition treaty" that would
18	include a timetable for the early and mutually verifiable elimination of nuclear
19	weapons, and
20	Whereas, shortly after the 33 towns approved this town meeting question,
21	the General Assembly adopted Acts and Resolves No. R-120, "Joint resolution
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1	relating to urgently requesting the U.S. government to immediately enter into
2	negotiations with all other nuclear nations for the adoption of a verifiable
3	treaty to abolish nuclear weapons," and
4	Whereas, on May 7, 2019, a retired Vermont Air National Guard Lieutenant
5	Colonel testified before the Senate Committee on Government Operations that
6	when the now-retired F-89 aircraft was stationed in Burlington it carried
7	nuclear warheads, but that neither the U.S. Department of Defense nor the U.S.
8	Air Force informed the State of Vermont that these weapons were being stored
9	locally, and
10	Whereas, the 2018 Nuclear Posture Review, a publication of the U.S.
11	Department of Defense, states that "We [the United States] are committed to
12	upgrading the DCA (Dual-Capable Aircraft) with the nuclear-capable F-35
13	aircraft," and further that "The United States is also incorporating nuclear
14	capability onto the F-35, to be used by the United States and NATO allies, as a
15	replacement for the current aging DCA," and
16	Whereas, in a July 2018 interview, an official in the U.S. Air Force's
17	Financial Management and Comptroller's office indicated that the variant of
18	the F-35 to be assigned to the National Guard will eventually receive a Block 4
19	(nuclear capable) upgrade, and
20	Resolved by the Senate of the State of Vermont:

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1	That the Senate of the State of Vermont expresses its strong opposition to
2	the basing of any nuclear delivery system in the State of Vermont, and be it
3	further
4	Resolved: That the Secretary of the Senate be directed to send a copy of
5	this resolution to the Governor, to Acting U.S. Secretary of Defense Patrick
6	Shanahan, and to the Vermont Congressional Delegation.
