SUBJECT: Residential Mental Health Analysis of Need- H.543 and H.528

In follow up to discussions with the Senate Committee on Institutions and with the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare, the Department of Mental Health is recommending the strikethrough and replacement of certain language in H.543, Section 28, and strikethrough of H.528, Section 2, (b) as presented on the following pages. The Department supports additional, data-driven processes to support any future investments in residential bed capacity.

H.543, SECTION 28. REPLACEMENT OF MIDDLESEX SECURE RESIDENTIAL RECOVERY FACILITY

Strikethrough section (a), sub-section (1,2); and replace as follows:

Sec. 28. REPLACEMENT OF MIDDLESEX PHYSICALLY SECURE RESIDENTIAL RECOVERY FACILITY

(a) Intent. To the extent that the Department of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent

Living (DAIL) amends its rules pertaining to therapeutic community residences to allow

secure residential recovery facilities to utilize emergency involuntary procedures and that

these rules are identical to the rules adopted by the Department of Mental Health governing

the use of emergency involuntary procedures in psychiatric inpatient units, it is the intent of

the General Assembly that the State shall replace the Middlesex Secure Residential

Recovery facility by:

(1) constructing a physicially secure State-owned residential recovery facility for up to an additional 16 beds; and

(2) exploring the placement of interim secure residential beds or permanent beds that could be flexible to meet other potential therapeutic community residential uses as determined by the Department of Mental Health under subdivision (b) of this section.

Strikethrough section (b) and replace as follows:

(b) DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH; ANALYSIS OF RESIDENTIAL MENTAL HEALTH NEEDS

(1) The Department of Mental Health shall evaluate and determine the mental health bed needs for residential programs across the State by geographic area and provider type including:

long term residences (group homes), Intensive Recovery Residences and Secure Residential.

This evaluation shall include but not be limited to: the review of current and historic occupancy rates, admission and referral data, assessment of barriers to access for individuals requiring residential services. The evaluation will include consultation with providers.

(2) On or before December 15, 2019, the Department shall provide to the House

Committees on Health Care and on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Health and

Welfare and on Appropriations its findings and recommendations. The report shall include an analysis of operating secure residential beds at Rutland Regional Medical Center (RRMC) and Rutland Mental Health Services (RMHS).
