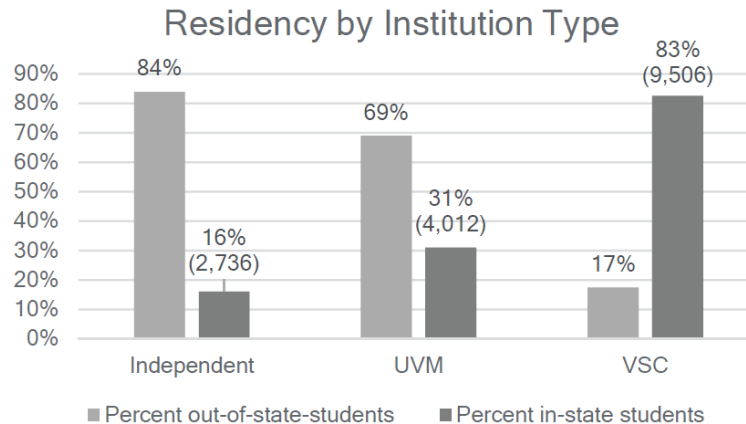


Figure 2: In-state vs out-of-state students, percentage by institution type (headcount)

VSCS Capital Appropriation Recent History

- FY2014-2017 — \$1.4 million base capital appropriation
- FY2018 — \$2.0 million
- FY2019 — \$3.0 million (\$2.0 million base + \$1 million supplemental)
- FY2020 -- Request that appropriation remain at \$ 3 million

Consequences of Low Capital Support

- \$60 million in deferred maintenance
- Out-dated dorms, laboratories, and learning spaces.
- Unmet Safety, access, and security needs.
- Inability to innovate to serve workforce needs.
