3	entitled "An act relating to fair and impartial policing" respectfully reports that
4	it has considered the same and recommends that the Senate propose to the
5	House that the bill be amended by striking out Sec. 2 in its entirety and
6	inserting in lieu thereof the following:
7	Sec. 2. JOINT LEGISLATIVE JUSTICE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE;
8	CIVIL RIGHTS WORKING GROUP; REPORT
9	(a) During the 2019 legislative interim, the Office of the Attorney General
10	shall convene and facilitate a working group of representatives from the
11	Human Rights Commission, the Vermont chapter of the American Civil
12	Liberties Union, the Criminal Justice Training Council, Migrant Justice, the
13	Vermont Police Association, the Vermont Sheriffs' Association, the Vermont
14	Association of Chiefs of Police, and the Vermont State Police. The working
15	group shall collaboratively establish an outreach and education strategy to
16	inform Vermonters of the resources available to protect civil rights pursuant to
17	State laws that prohibit discrimination, including the right to file a complaint
18	with the Human Rights Commission, the Civil Rights Unit of the Office of the
19	Attorney General, law enforcement agencies, and the Criminal Justice Training
20	Council.

1	(b) On or before November 1, 2019, the working group established
2	pursuant to this section shall report to the Joint Legislative Justice Oversight
3	Committee and the House and Senate Committees on Judiciary and on
4	Government Operations on their work pursuant to subsection (a) of this section
5	and recommendations for legislative action to protect marginalized populations
6	in Vermont.
