# Court Diversion and Pretrial Services

#### **Court Diversion**

In this restorative justice program, participants meet with those directly harmed and community
members to decide how to repair the harm caused to victims and the larger community, and how to
address factors that led to their breaking the law.

 Statewide, prosecutors are referring over a third of misdemeanors to Diversion and Tamarack.

**Tamarack** 

 This is a Diversion program for adults with substance use or mental health treatment needs regardless of their criminal record. In FY 19, referrals from Criminal Division increased 25% (from 2,337 to 3,002) from FY 18.

#### **Pretrial Services**

- This service is for adults with substance use or mental health treatment needs who are going through the court process and awaiting resolution of their case.
- In FY 2019, judges issued over 700 Pretrial Services orders.
- Coordinators quickly connect people to substance use, mental health, and other supportive community-based services.

### **Youth Substance Abuse Safety Program**

- Youth aged 16 to 20 who violate Vermont's underage possession and consumption of alcohol and marijuana laws participate in this program as an alternative to a fine and driver's license suspension.
- Following a screening and brief educational intervention, over 90% successfully complete the program.
- Youth who screen at higher risk are referred to a clinician for an assessment.

## **Driving with License Suspended Program**

• Over 1,200 individuals received help in FY 2019 navigating the Judicial Bureau and DMV to identify requirements for license reinstatement.

These services reduce the workload and costs of the Courts, State's Attorneys, and the Department of Corrections.

## **Funding**

- First-time Diversion participants recidivate at a lower rate (<1%) compared to people convicted through the Courts (8.9%), according to a study done by Crime Research Group.
- Diversion is much less expensive than standard criminal justice system: e.g. an assault case costs \$216 when handled by Diversion and \$1,480 when adjudicated in Court. (Crime Research Group study)
- 14 county programs are run by non-profit agencies or municipalities under grant agreements with the Attorney General's Office.
- All are members of the Vermont Association of Court Diversion & Pretrial Services (VACDP).
- The FY 2020 appropriation is \$2,715,486 of General Funds.
