7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require that
8	Vermonters be personally responsible for their greenhouse gas emissions.
9	An act relating to greenhouse gas emissions
10	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
11	Sec. 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS
12	(1) Climate change poses a serious threat to the environment, general
13	welfare, and economy of Vermont and is both caused and exacerbated by
14	greenhouse gas emissions resulting from human activity.
15	(2) All Vermonters bear a personal responsibility to reduce or offset
16	their greenhouse gas emissions in order to address the problem of climate
17	<u>change.</u>
18	(3) Vermont's fields and forests sequester greenhouse gases. For
19	example, one acre of Vermont forest can sequester the equivalent of the annual

1	emissions of 83 vehicles. As a result, Vermont's landscape, and especially its
2	forests, can serve an important role in addressing climate change.
3	(4) Vermonters who own, and maintain, healthy forests should not only
4	be recognized for serving this important role, but they also should be able to
5	benefit from the role their property fills in offsetting the greenhouse gas
6	emissions of other residents.
7	Sec. 2. 10 V.S.A. § 587 is added to read:
8	§ 587. GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS; STATE RESIDENTS
9	(a) Every individual who resides in the State and whose income exceeds
10	150 percent of the federal poverty level shall:
11	(1) Track and report to the Agency of Natural Resources greenhouse gas
12	emissions attributable to his or her activities and property, including:
13	(A) electricity, fuel, and energy usage;
14	(B) employment;
15	(C) recreational activities;
16	(D) travel;
17	(E) diet;
18	(F) consumption of consumer goods;
19	(G) the heating and cooling of all buildings or structures that the
20	individual owns or has an ownership interest in; and

1	(H) any other activity or emissions source that the Secretary of the
2	Agency of Natural Resources deems appropriate.
3	(2) Track and report to the Agency of Natural Resources greenhouse gas
4	emission reductions and offsets attributable to his or her activities and property
5	including emissions sequestration.
6	(3) Take substantial and verifiable actions to reduce or offset the
7	greenhouse gas emissions attributable to his or her activities and property as
8	necessary for the State to meet the greenhouse gas reduction goals pursuant to
9	subsection 578(a) of this title.
10	(b) The Secretary of the Agency of Natural Resources, in consultation with
11	all appropriate stakeholders, shall, on or before June 1, 2021, adopt rules
12	pursuant to 3 V.S.A. chapter 25 to implement the provisions of this section,
13	including:
14	(1) The tracking and reporting of greenhouse gas emissions and
15	reductions pursuant to subdivisions (a)(1) and (2) of this section.
16	(2) The verification and storage of information and data reported to the
17	Secretary pursuant to subdivisions (a)(1) and (2) of this section.
18	(3) The assignment of value to emissions reductions in a manner that
19	will allow an individual subject to this section to derive benefit from emissions
20	reductions attributable to his or her activities and property. Emissions
21	reductions and offsets attributable to activities and property within the State

1	shall be assigned a greater value and prioritized so that an individual shall only
2	be able to derive a benefit from emissions reductions and offsets attributable to
3	activities and property outside the State if reductions and offsets attributable to
4	activities and property within the State are not available or feasible.
5	(4) The assignment of value to emissions offsets in a manner that will
6	allow an individual who resides in Vermont to derive benefit from greenhouse
7	gas sequestration and other offsets that are attributable to his or her activities
8	and property located in the State.
9	(5) The assignment of a numerical score or letter grade to each
10	individual subject to this section that shall convey, in an easy-to-understand
11	format, the individual's greenhouse gas emissions and comparative
12	contribution to meeting the State's goals pursuant to subsection 578(a) of this
13	title.
14	(c) The Secretary shall, on or before January 15, 2022 and every January 15
15	thereafter, provide a written report to the General Assembly concerning the
16	implementation of this section. The Secretary may include recommendations
17	for legislative action as appropriate.
18	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
19	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
