

No. R-22. House concurrent resolution in memory of historic preservation architect Martin S. Tierney of Burlington.

(H.C.R.14)

Whereas, Martin Tierney earned a master's degree in architecture from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, and he became one of Vermont's premier experts in designing historic preservation projects, and

Whereas, among his career highlights were impressive endeavors at Shelburne Farms, the Elley-Long Music Center in Colchester, the Richmond Round Church, and Burlington's Union Station and Warner Block, and

Whereas, he chaired the Capitol Complex Commission and the Vermont Advisory Council on Historic Preservation and served on the Friends of the Vermont State House and the Preservation Trust of Vermont, and

Whereas, this widely respected Renaissance man, with amazingly diverse avocational interests, died in December 2020, and his survivors include his wife, Linda, his children, and his grandchildren, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly fondly remembers historic preservation architect Martin S. Tierney of Burlington, and be it further
