7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to allow the use
8	of sluice boxes for recreational mineral prospecting in watercourses, subject to
9	specified conditions.

12	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
13	Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 1021 is amended to read:
14	§ 1021. ALTERATION PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS
15	(a) A person shall not change, alter, or modify the course, current, or cross
16	section of any watercourse or of designated outstanding resource waters,
17	within or along the boundaries of this State either by movement, fill, or
18	excavation of ten cubic yards or more of instream material in any year, unless
19	authorized by the Secretary. A person shall not establish or construct a berm

in a flood hazard area or river corridor, as those terms are defined in

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watercourse;

1	subdivisions 752(3) and (11) of this title, unless permitted by the Secretary or
2	constructed as an emergency protective measure under subsection (b) of this
3	section.
4	* * *
5	(h)(1) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, recreational
6	mineral prospectors:
7	(A) shall not operate suction dredges in any watercourse;
8	(B) may operate <u>a nonmotorized</u> sluice <u>boxes</u> <u>box</u> in any
9	watercourse, provided that:
10	(i) a request for approval to conduct mineral prospecting shall be
11	filed with and approved by the Secretary; and
12	(ii) mineral prospecting shall not be conducted on private land
13	without landowner permission, or on State land without permission from the
14	Secretary only one sluice box is used per person engaged in prospecting;
15	(ii) the sluice box is not larger than 60 inches long;
16	(iii) the sluice box is hand operated;
17	(iv) excavation takes place in the bed of the watercourse, and no
18	excavation or other disturbance occurs in or on the banks of a watercourse;
19	(v) no material from outside the watercourse is deposited into the

1	(vi) instream material is not deposited onto the banks of the
2	watercourse, or on adjacent land;
3	(vii) excavation is not conducted in a wetland, as that term is
4	defined in section 902 of this title; and
5	(viii) excavation is conducted in a State watercourse or on private
6	property with the permission of the private-property owner.
7	(2) Hand panning prospecting techniques shall be exempt from this
8	subchapter.
9	(3) A person shall not be required to obtain a permit from the Secretary
10	of Natural Resources under this subchapter for hand panning prospecting or for
11	use of a sluice box that meets the requirements of subdivision (1) of this
12	subsection.
