7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to create the
8	Office of Native American Affairs with the purpose of providing aid and
9	assistance to Native Americans.
10	An act relating to creating the Office of Native American Affairs
11	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
12	Sec. 1. 1 V.S.A. § 857 is added to read:
13	§ 857. OFFICE OF NATIVE AMERICAN AFFAIRS; DIRECTOR; DUTIES
14	(a) The Office of Native American Affairs is created within the Department
15	of Housing and Community Development. The Office shall be headed by an
16	executive director appointed by the Commissioner of Housing and Community
17	Development.
18	(b) In addition to the duties elsewhere set forth by law, the Executive
19	Director of the Office of Native American Affairs shall:

1	(1) ensure that the employees of the Office are familiar with the federal,
2	State, and local laws enacted for the benefit of Native Americans and their
3	heirs and beneficiaries; collect data and information as to facilities and services
4	available to them; and cooperate with informational or service agencies
5	throughout the State to inform Native Americans and their heirs and
6	beneficiaries regarding the existence or availability of:
7	(A) educational training and retraining services and facilities;
8	(B) health, medical, rehabilitation, and housing services and
9	facilities;
10	(C) employment and reemployment services; and
11	(D) provisions of federal, State, and local laws affording rights,
12	privileges, and benefits to Native Americans and their families and dependents,
13	and other related matters;
14	(2) assist Native Americans and their heirs and beneficiaries in the
15	presentation, proof, and establishment of any claims, privileges, rights, and
16	other benefits that they may have pursuant to federal, State, or local laws; and
17	(3) cooperate with all national, State, and local governmental and
18	private agencies in securing services and benefits to Native Americans and
19	their families and dependents.
20	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
21	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
