7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to prohibit
8	employers from discriminating or retaliating against employees who are absent
9	from work while performing duties as volunteer firefighters and to require
10	employers to pay volunteer firefighters for time spent responding to an
11	emergency.
12	An act relating to employment protections for volunteer firefighters
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 21 V.S.A. § 4950 is added to read:
15	<u>§ 4950. VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS</u>
16	(a) As used in this section, "firefighter" has the same meaning as in
17	<u>20 V.S.A. § 3151(3).</u>
18	(b) An employer shall not discharge, discriminate, or retaliate against an
19	employee because the employee was absent from work to perform duty as a

1	volunteer firefighter, including responding to an emergency or attending
2	necessary training.
3	(c)(1) An employer shall compensate an employee at the employee's
4	normal hourly wage rate for any time that the employee is absent from work
5	because the employee is responding to an emergency as a volunteer firefighter.
6	(2) An employer shall not be required to compensate an employee for
7	time that an employee is absent from employment to attend necessary training
8	as a volunteer firefighter.
9	(3)(A) An employer may require an employee to use accrued paid leave
10	for time that the employee is absent from work to attend necessary training as a
11	volunteer firefighter, provided that the employer shall compensate the
12	employee for any accrued time off used at the employee's normal hourly wage
13	<u>rate.</u>
14	(B) Notwithstanding subdivision (A) of this subdivision (c)(3), an
15	employer shall not prevent an employee from attending necessary training as a
16	volunteer firefighter due to a lack of accrued paid leave.
17	(d) An employee shall notify the employee's employer at the time the
18	employee becomes a volunteer firefighter and shall provide the employer with
19	a written statement signed by the chief of the volunteer fire department stating
20	that the employee is a volunteer firefighter.

1	(e) Nothing in this section shall prohibit an employer from requiring an
2	employee to provide reasonable notice that the employee is leaving work to
3	respond to an emergency or must be absent from work to attend necessary
4	training.
5	(f) This section shall not apply to any public safety agency or provider of
6	emergency medical services if, as determined by the employer, the employee's
7	absence would hinder the availability of public safety or emergency medical
8	services.

10	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
