8	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to:
9	(1) establish the Working Group on the Status of Libraries in Vermont
10	to report on the current status of Vermont's libraries and recommend
11	improvements to the public library system; and
12	(2) update and make technical corrections to certain statutes concerning
13	the Vermont Department of Libraries.

17	Sec. 1. WORKING GROUP ON THE STATUS OF LIBRARIES IN
18	VERMONT; REPORT
19	(a) Creation. There is created the Working Group on the Status of

Libraries in Vermont to study and report on the statewide status of Vermont's

1	libraries. The Working Group is formed with the intent of strengthening and
2	supporting libraries of all sizes and improving library services for the public.
3	(b) Membership. The Working Group shall be composed of the following
4	members:
5	(1) the State Librarian;
6	(2) the President of the Vermont Library Association or designee;
7	(3) the Executive Director of the Vermont Humanities Council or
8	designee;
9	(4) three representatives of public libraries, who shall be from libraries
10	of different sizes and from different regions of the State, appointed by the State
11	<u>Librarian;</u>
12	(5) two representatives of public school libraries, who shall be from
13	schools of different sizes and from different regions of the State, appointed by
14	the Secretary of Education;
15	(6) two representatives of college and university libraries, appointed by
16	the President of the College and Special Libraries Section of the Vermont
17	Library Association; and
18	(7) one public library trustee, appointed by the President of the Friends
19	and Trustees Section of the Vermont Library Association.
20	(c) Powers and Duties. The Working Group shall study:

1	(1) library services for specific segments of the Vermont population,
2	including senior citizens, individuals with disabilities, youths and children,
3	immigrant and migrant communities, and people living in poverty;
4	(2) the role that libraries play in emergency preparedness, cultural
5	diversity and inclusion, public health and safety, community identity and
6	resiliency, economic development, and access to public programs and services
7	(3) the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on library operations and
8	services; and
9	(4) the current overall status of Vermont libraries, which may include
10	information related to programming, collections, facilities, technology, and
11	staffing.
12	(A) Programming. The Working Group may study the types and
13	frequency of library programs, attendance at library programs, and whether
14	library programs are meeting community needs. The study of programming
15	may include an assessment of public engagement and outreach surrounding
16	library programming as well as the opportunities for nonlibrary programs and
17	groups to access Vermont libraries.
18	(B) Collections. The Working Group may study the size and
19	diversity of library holdings and assess the strengths and gaps in materials
20	available to Vermonters. The study of collections may include an assessment
21	of how libraries may best share resources across differing libraries and

1	communities, whether libraries offer community-specific resources, and
2	whether libraries maintain special collections or historical artifacts.
3	(C) Facilities. The Working Group may study whether library
4	facilities and buildings could be improved with regard to energy efficiency,
5	accessibility, flexibility, human health and safety, historic preservation, and
6	intergenerational needs.
7	(D) Technology. The Working Group may study whether Vermont
8	libraries have sufficient access to basic technological resources, cyber-security
9	resources, high-speed Internet, electronic catalogs, interlibrary loan and other
10	interoperable systems, and appropriate hardware and software.
11	(E) Staff. The Working Group may study staffing levels at Vermont
12	libraries, whether staffing levels are sufficient to meet community needs,
13	whether library staff compensation and benefits are sufficient, how libraries
14	rely on volunteers, and what resources are available for workforce
15	development and training of library staff.
16	(d) Public Input. As part of the study and report, the Working Group shall
17	solicit feedback from the general public and library users around the State.
18	The Working Group may examine models for library management and
19	organization in other states, including the formation of statewide service
20	networks.

1	(e) Data to be used. The data used in the analysis of library services and
2	operations may be from 2019, prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. Post-
3	pandemic data may also be used to assess the status of library services and
4	operations.
5	(f) Consultation with the Board of Libraries. The Working Group may
6	solicit feedback from the Board of Libraries.
7	(g) Assistance. The Working Group shall have the administrative,
8	technical, and legal assistance of the Department of Libraries.
9	(h) Report. On or before November 1, 2023, the Working Group shall
10	submit a report to the House and Senate Committees on Education. The report
11	shall contain:
12	(1) specific and detailed findings and proposals concerning the issues set
13	forth in subsection (c) of this section;
14	(2) recommendations for updating the statutes, rules, standards, and the
15	governance structures of Vermont libraries to ensure equitable access for
16	Vermont residents, efficient use of resources, and quality in the provision of
17	services;
18	(3) recommendations related to the funding needs of Vermont libraries,
19	including capital, ongoing, and special funding; and
20	(4) any other information or recommendations that the Working Group
21	may deem necessary.

1	(i) Meetings.
2	(1) The State Librarian shall be the Chair of the Working Group.
3	(2) The Chair shall call the first meeting of the Working Group to occur
4	within 45 days after the effective date of this act.
5	(3) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.
6	(4) The Working Group shall cease to exist on December 1, 2023.
7	(j) Compensation and reimbursement. Members of the Working Group
8	shall be entitled to per diem compensation and reimbursement of expenses as
9	permitted under 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for not more than 12 meetings. These
10	payments shall be made from monies appropriated to the Department of
11	<u>Libraries.</u>
12	(k) Appropriation. The sum of \$4,000.00 is appropriated to Department of
13	<u>Libraries from the General Fund in fiscal year 2022 for per diem compensation</u>
14	and reimbursement of expenses for members of the Working Group.

The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services may require satisfactory bonds from bidders and contractors, and shall specify in each contract for printing that, in case the matter contracted for is not delivered to the State Librarian or in accordance with his or her written order to such other person as may be specified in the contract, on or before the date specified in the contract for such delivery, \$25.00 of the contract price shall be deducted for every day such delivery is delayed, and, in case the delay exceeds 10 days, there shall be deducted in addition to the above amount \$10.00 for each day's delay over 10 days; and he or she shall also specify in each contract that all public documents and printed matter shall be delivered to the State Librarian at the State Library unless otherwise directed in writing by him or her or the State Librarian. The provisions of this section and section 1107 of this title relating

2	amount of the contract does not exceed \$50.00.
