18	(2) milk or a nut-based or plant-based beverage; or

1	(3) 100 percent fruit juice or fruit juice combined with water or
2	carbonated water that does not contain added sweeteners, in a serving size of
3	not more than eight ounces.
4	(b) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a food service establishment from
5	selling or providing, or a customer from purchasing, a beverage other than the
6	default beverage included with a children's meal if the customer requests a
7	substitute beverage.
8	(c) As used in this section:
9	(1) "Children's meal" means a combination of food items and a
10	beverage, primarily intended for consumption by children, sold together at a
11	single price.
12	(2) "Default beverage" means the beverage automatically included as
13	part of a children's meal.

15	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
