Whereas, the Georgia Elementary and Middle School's faculty and staff instruct students on how to react if an active shooter is present, and

<u>Whereas</u>, the response process known as ALICE (Alert-Lockdown-Inform-Counter-Evacuate) emphasizes the seriousness of an active shooter situation,

the importance of not panicking, and the imperative of behaving proactively and responsibly, and
