House concurrent resolution honoring Barre Town's Town Clerk and Treasurer, Donna Kelty

<u>Whereas</u>, in 1989, Donna Kelty was appointed the Assistant Town Clerk for Barre Town, and in 2000 she won the first of six consecutive terms as the municipality's town clerk-treasurer, and

<u>Whereas</u>, she earned town clerk and town treasurer certifications from the Vermont Municipal Clerks' and Treasurers' Association (VMCTA), and

Whereas, in 2011, the VMCTA honored Donna Kelty as both its Treasurer and Clerk of the Year, and she held leadership roles in the organization, and

<u>Whereas</u>, she administered same-day voter registration and drive-through polling at early special elections, providing the Secretary of State informative guidance for statewide application, and

Whereas, in 2021 Donna Kelty is concluding her illustrious municipal career, now therefore be it

Whereas, in the 1980s, he served as the First Assistant U.S. Attorney for Vermont, and from 2001 to 2004 as Vermont's U.S. Attorney, and

<u>Whereas</u>, while practicing as a private trial lawyer in Rutland, Peter Hall was elected president of the Vermont Bar Association, and

<u>Whereas</u>, President George W. Bush nominated Peter Hall to the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, and

<u>Whereas</u>, he served from 2004–2021, was dedicated to equal protection and the rule of law, and represented the U.S. judiciary internationally, and

<u>Whereas</u>, as a Vermont Law School Trustee, Judge Hall mentored students and alumni through judicial externships and clerkships, and

Whereas, Judge Peter Hall died on March 11, 2021, and his survivors include his wife, Maria, his children, and grandchildren, now therefore be it
