### H.C.R. 58.

House concurrent resolution honoring Timothy Noonan for his leadership at the Vermont Labor Relations Board and in the Montpelier community

<u>Whereas</u>, for 38 years, Tim Noonan has served as the Vermont Labor Relations Board's Executive Director, managing the board's docket, advising on the drafting of case decisions, and conducting educational seminars, and

<u>Whereas</u>, he is the author of five successive editions of *The Evolving Vermont Labor Relations Law* and of a Vermont labor law statutory guide, and

<u>Whereas</u>, his colleagues regionally and nationally have selected Tim Noonan for leadership positions in their professional organizations, and

<u>Whereas</u>, he has coached high school cross country, has run in dozens of marathons, and serves as the Montpelier Food Pantry's president, and

<u>Whereas</u>, Tim Noonan is now concluding his career at the Vermont Labor Relations Board, having achieved a distinguished record, now therefore be it

<u>Whereas</u>, he served under former U.S. Representative Jim Jeffords as a professional staff member of the House Agriculture Committee and as the congressman's Chief of Staff, and

<u>Whereas</u>, his expertise was invaluable while heading the National Agricultural Land Study, serving as Director of Policy Development at the American Farmland Trust, working as an agricultural policy consultant, and being the Senior Dairy Advisor at the Northeast Dairy Farmers Cooperative, and
