S.C.R. 4. Senate concurrent resolution recognizing the week of April 18–24 2021 as Medical Laboratory Professionals Week in Vermont and the essential role of Vermont's medical laboratories during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Whereas, accurate and fast laboratory testing has been integral to Vermont's response to the historic and deadly COVID-19 pandemic, and

Whereas, medical laboratory professionals at Vermont's hospitals and at the Department of Health laboratory have met this challenge, and

Whereas, in Vermont, almost 1.5 million COVID-19 diagnostic tests have been administered to approximately 370,000 persons, over 21,500 cases have been confirmed, and in excess of 240 deaths have been recorded, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly recognizes the week of April 18–24 2021 as Medical Laboratory Professionals Week in Vermont and the essential role of Vermont's medical laboratories during the COVID-19 pandemic, *and be it further*
