
Workgroup Transformation


Independent Assessment Process



Request for Proposal went out



Commitment statements:

DCF is focused on providing high quality, trauma informed, specialized residential care in VT


DCF values its in-state programs and their commitment to the treatment of our most vulnerable population

 DCF will be working with ALL programs individually to figure out how to braid those into our overall system of care both through the QRTP system or by serving a carve out population
