

Who We Serve

MSW Students with IVE Scholarships – which are then "repaid" with a commitment to work for VT Family Services Division for 3 years (4-5 Scholarships each academic year)

How many Foster Parents completed training through VT CWTP?

FY20 (July 2019-June 2020

- 480 Caregivers completed Orientation
- 770 Caregivers completed Foundations
- 246 Caregivers completed Fostering to Forever
- 254 Caregivers completed Advanced Caregiver Training

Resource Parent Curriculum PLUS Trauma Informed Parenting Skills (RPC+TIPS)

97% of resource parents completing the Resource Parent Curriculum plus Trauma informed Parenting Skills (RPC+TIPS) training stated that they were less likely to request a placement change for a child in their care in the future ." -Placement Stability Project, Executive Summary

Since 2014 over **560** foster, adoptive and kin caregivers in Vermont have graduated from RPC+ TIPS for Tuning In

10-week workshop that educates foster, adoptive and kin caregivers about the impact of trauma on the development, attachment, emotions and behaviors of the children & youth in their care. The workshop provides:

concrete strategies to manage daily and ongoing challenges, enhance relationships with their children and build a network of support and connections with fellow caregivers.



Feedback from Foster Parents RPC+TIPS

Foster mom of young children: "By increasing our understanding of trauma and being positive, sometimes it takes a bit more for these traumatized children in our care. As we are reminded in this class, the more positive feedback and praise given, the more the behavior will change. Turn things around and you will be surprised on how well it really does work! This class reminded me to look for the positive and by giving these kids more control. They will feel safe and comfortable, and will act in a more positive way. I've been practicing it and it works!"

Foster father of teen boys: "It's easy for us who have not lived through trauma to forget that something innocuous can ignite the fuse to a ticking time bomb, it's classes like this that help us defuse that bomb or help to put the pieces back after it has gone off."

Pre-Adoptive Parent: "I thoroughly enjoyed this class, it was much better than I was expecting. Usually I don't go to these kinds of trainings because I think they are boring and your sitting behind a desk all day not retaining the information. This course was not like that, it was engaging and filled with great real-life material and skills."

Where can caregivers access RPC+TIPS?



VT CWTP has trained MH Designated Agencies in all 12 Districts served by FSD using a Training of Trainer model with coaching and mentoring. FSD has financially supported the DAs classes, paying for manuals, childcare and space.

VT CWTP continues to offer 1-2 sessions per year for specific groups:

FY21 we offered:

- 2 sessions for adoptive parents and;
- a session to the VT Coalition of Residential Programs; 20 staff from 12 different residential programs completed the course and the TOT workshop and will begin teaching their staff this fall.
