




WHO DOES IT?

DEPARTMENT FOR CHILDREN & FAMILIES (DCF)

FAMILY SERVICES DIVISION (FSD)

RESIDENTIAL LICENSING AND SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS UNIT (RLSI)



RLSI Director oversees:

- North Team
- South Team
- Agency Team
- Administrative Team

RLSI serves two main functions:

1. License and Regulate

- Foster/Kin Homes
- Residential Treatment Programs
- Child Placing Agencies
- Commissioner-Designated Shelters

2. Special Investigations

Child Safety Interventions (investigations and assessments)

OUR FOUR SETS OF REGULATIONS

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAMS (RTP)

Facilities providing planned program aimed at behavioral change in residential setting.

CHILD PLACING AGENCIES (CPA)


Agencies providing foster care and adoption services.

COMMISSIONER DESIGNATED SHELTERS (CDS)

Agencies providing shelter to minors.

FOSTER CARE

DCF-licensed general care and kinship foster homes.



ABOUT THE AGENCY TEAM



• RLSI's Agency Team:

- 1 Supervisor
- 2 Family Services Workers

We are charged with regulating and licensing:

- 21 Residential Treatment Programs
- 11 Child Placing Agencies
- 10 Commissioner-Designated Shelters
- Our specific RTP licensing process is covered by DCF Policy 241.

RLSI CONNECTS WITH RTPS FOR:

Licensing Visits

Routine, on-site visits to rate compliance of each regulation and determine ongoing licensure status.

Child Safety Interventions


Includes both Chapter 49 Investigations and Assessments.

Regulatory Interventions

An intervention to determine if any violations are found to individual RTP Regulations as a result of a specific incident, report, or complaint.

Consultations

Ongoing communication to discuss variances, incidents, general questions, etc.



REGULATORY PROCESS

RECEIVE A COMPLAINT

- CIES
- Directly from RTP
- Grievance from youth
- Report from family or attorney

REPORT ACCEPTED


- Assign to RLSI Agency Team
- Contact program administrator
- Interview youth and staff
- Review documentation and collateral information.

REPORT NOT ACCEPTED

 If there is not enough information related to a possible violation of regulation, a regulatory intervention is not accepted.

OUTCOME

- Program in compliance (no violations
- Program is not in compliance (clarify expectations, educate, violations cited, corrective action plan)
- Programs are notified verbally and in writing of findings.



AT A GLANCE: LICENSING RTPS

LICENSING CYCLE

RTP licenses are issued in two-year iterations.

ON-SITE VISITS

Licensing visits take approximately 2 - 3 days.

LICENSING REPORTS

RLSI will consolidate all licensing visit information into a licensing report.

APPLICATION


The RTP agency provide an application and attachments to RLSI.

DEBRIEF MEETINGS

We review licensing findings with the program before finalizing ratings to understand their perspective and see if there's anything we've missed.

INTERIM VISITS

On-site visits are scheduled at RTPs on the non-renewal years so we can be in the facilities at least annually.



THE LICENSING VISIT

OPENING MEETING

Discuss program changes and review of investigations and interventions.

CHILD INTERVIEWS

Align child file reviews with resident interviews

STAFF INTERVIEWS

Interview staff in different roles at the program

FACILITY TOUR


Tour all aspects of the residential facility (bedrooms, programming spaces, education areas, etc.)

CHILD FILES

Current and discharged resident files

PERSONNEL FILES

Focus on background checks, performance evaluations, and training documentation



THE LICENSING REPORT

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Assess the alignment with therapeutic services and programming with population served.

NARRATIVE SECTION

Narratives capture the qualitative information gathered during the visit.

CORRECTIVE ACTION

A corrective action plan can be developed for all regulations rated as C* or NC.

RATING REGULATIONS

Each RTP Regulation is rated as C (in compliance), C* (compliance with reservations), or NC (noncompliance).

FINAL COMMENTS AND LICENSING PARAMETERS

Summarize findings, recommendations, and licensing parameters.
