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3	Sec. 1. GAP ECONOMIC RECOVERY GRANTS; FY 2021 ONE-TIME
4	APPROPRIATION
5	(a) Appropriation. The amount of \$10,000,000.00 is appropriated from the
6	General Fund to the Agency of Commerce and Community Development to
7	provide grants to businesses that:
8	(1) have experienced financial losses due to the COVID-19 public
9	health emergency and related restrictions under the Governor's declared state
10	of emergency; and
11	(2) have not been eligible, or are not eligible, for State or federal grant
12	programs introduced since March 2020.
13	(b) Eligibility. To be eligible for a grant a business shall meet the
14	following criteria:
15	(1) The business is domiciled or has its primary place of business in
16	<u>Vermont.</u>
17	(2) The business is organized and operated:
18	(A) on a for profit basis, including a sole proprietor, partnership,
19	limited liability company, business corporation, cooperative, or mutual benefit
20	enterprise; or

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1	(B) on a nonprofit or low-profit basis, including a mutual benefit
2	corporation, public benefit corporation, and a low-profit limited liability
3	<u>company.</u>
4	(3) The business is:
5	(A) open for business at the time of application; or
6	(B) closed for business due to the COVID-19 public health
7	emergency but has a good-faith plan for reopening.
8	(4) The business has suffered economic loss due to the COVID-19
9	public health emergency and economic crisis.
10	(b) Grants; administration.
11	(1) The Agency shall award grants on a first come, first served basis,
12	except that for the first 30 days of the program, the Agency shall give priority
13	to eligible businesses that began operation or were acquired after February 15,
14	2020; and
15	(2) After the first 30 days of the program, the Agency may exercise its
16	discretion in prioritizing grants based one or more of the following factors:
17	(A) whether a business was unable to operate because of the
18	Governor's declared state of emergency;
19	(B) whether a business suffered an operating loss;
20	(C) whether a business was unable to obtain grants or loans that may
21	be later forgiven;

1	(D) whether a business will use funds to reopen or modify its
2	operations to remain open;
3	(E) whether a business will use funds to cover payroll and personnel
4	costs or fixed operating expenses until the Governor's declared state of
5	emergency is lifted;
6	(F) whether the business is the primary source of income for a
7	household.
8	(1) The amount of a grant shall not exceed the lesser of:
9	(A) three times the business's fixed monthly expenses for
10	commercial mortgage or rent, utilities, insurance, and supplies required to
11	operate during the state of emergency; or
12	<u>(B) \$150,000.00.</u>
13	(2) The Agency may use not more than two percent of the funds
14	appropriated for administration of grants.
15	(d) Guidelines. Not later than ten days after the effective date of this act,
16	the Agency shall publish guidelines governing the implementation of the
17	program and to prioritize grants based on the degree to which a business,
18	which at minimum shall:
19	(1) establish application and award procedures;
20	(2) establish standards to determine whether a business has its primary
21	place of business in Vermont;

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1	(3) establish standards for eligible uses of grant funds;
2	(4) establish standards governing the amount of grant awards:
3	(A) to ensure the equitable distribution of funds among regions and
4	among business types, sizes, and sectors; and
5	(B) to ensure that grants are based on need and will have a
6	meaningful impact on the business's continued viability;
7	(5) establish procedures to ensure that grant awards comply with the
8	requirements of this section and that the State maintains adequate records to
9	demonstrate compliance with this section;
10	(6) establish procedures to prevent, detect, and mitigate fraud, waste,
11	error, and abuse; and
12	(7) establish procedures to ensure that grant applicants are in
13	compliance with State and federal employment and labor laws.
14	(e) Reporting. The Agency shall:
15	(1) provide weekly updates and information concerning grant
16	guidelines, awards, and implementation to the committees of jurisdiction of the
17	General Assembly; and
18	(2) submit a report to the General Assembly on or before August 15,
19	2021 detailing the implementation of this section, including specific
20	information concerning the amount and identity of grant recipients, which shall
21	be publicly available.

4	(3) was unable to obtain grants or loans that may later be forgiven
5	(4) is the primary source of income for a household;
6	(4) will use the funds to reopen or modify its operations to remain open;

9	emergency is ended.
