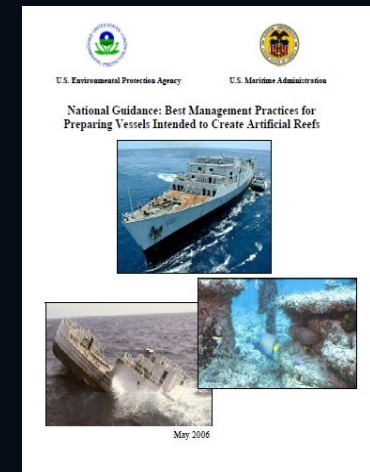

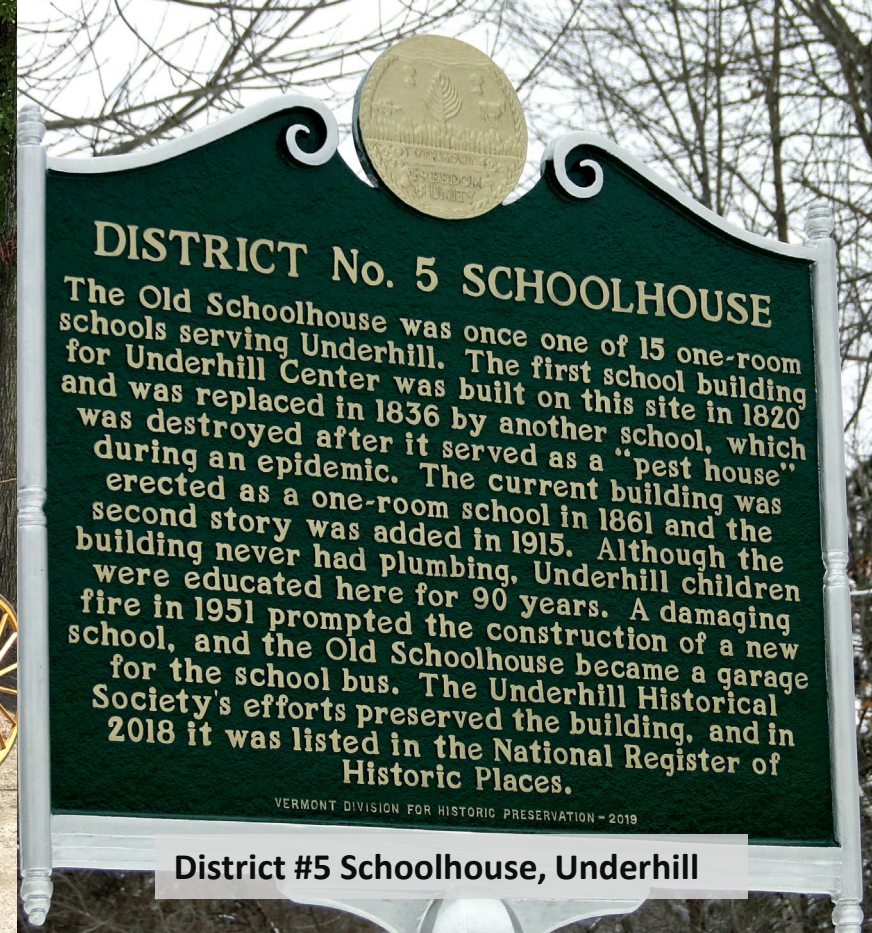

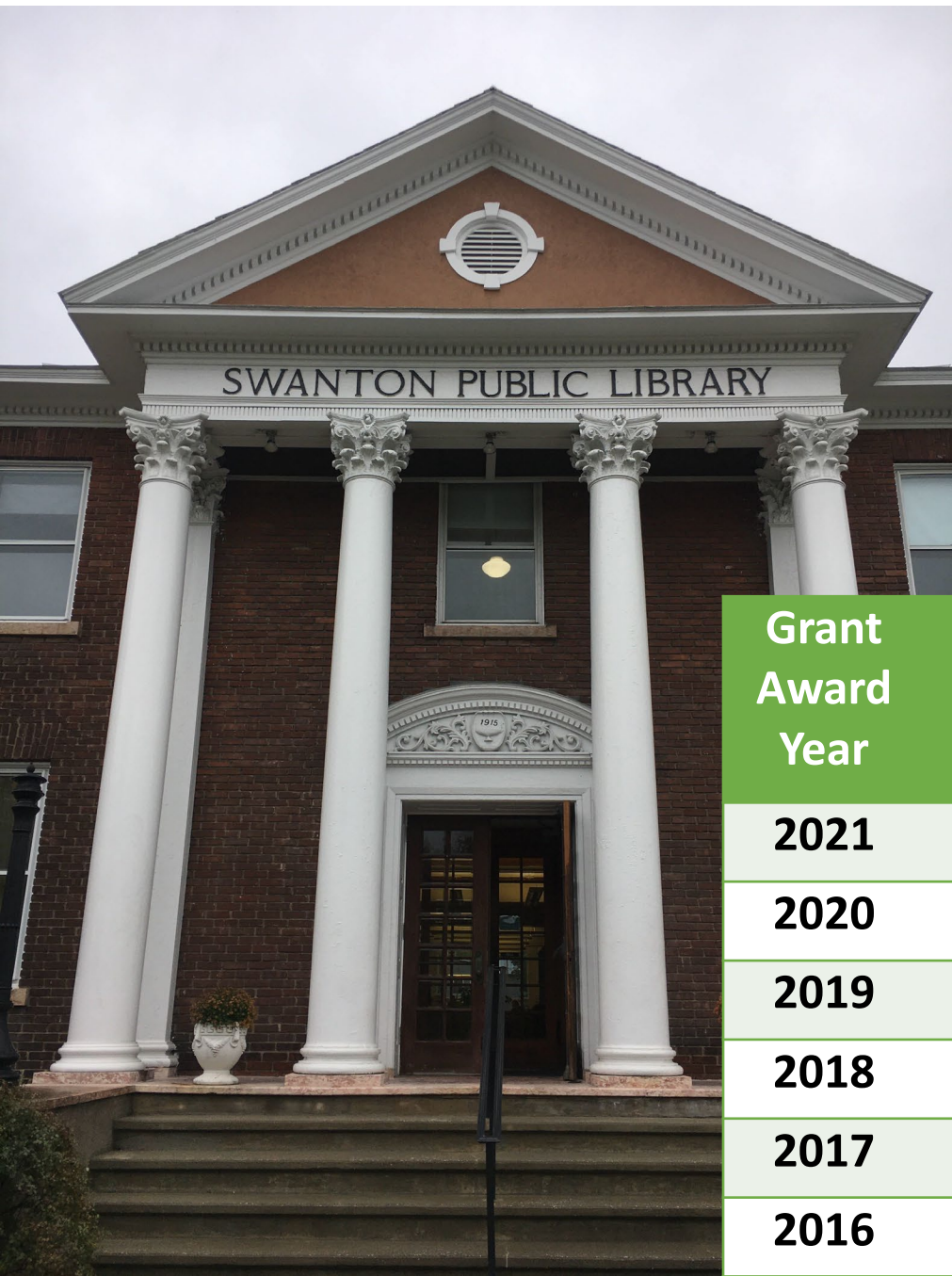
Unmarked Burial Fund

- documentation and reburial of artifacts (grave goods)
- various assessments and research projects
