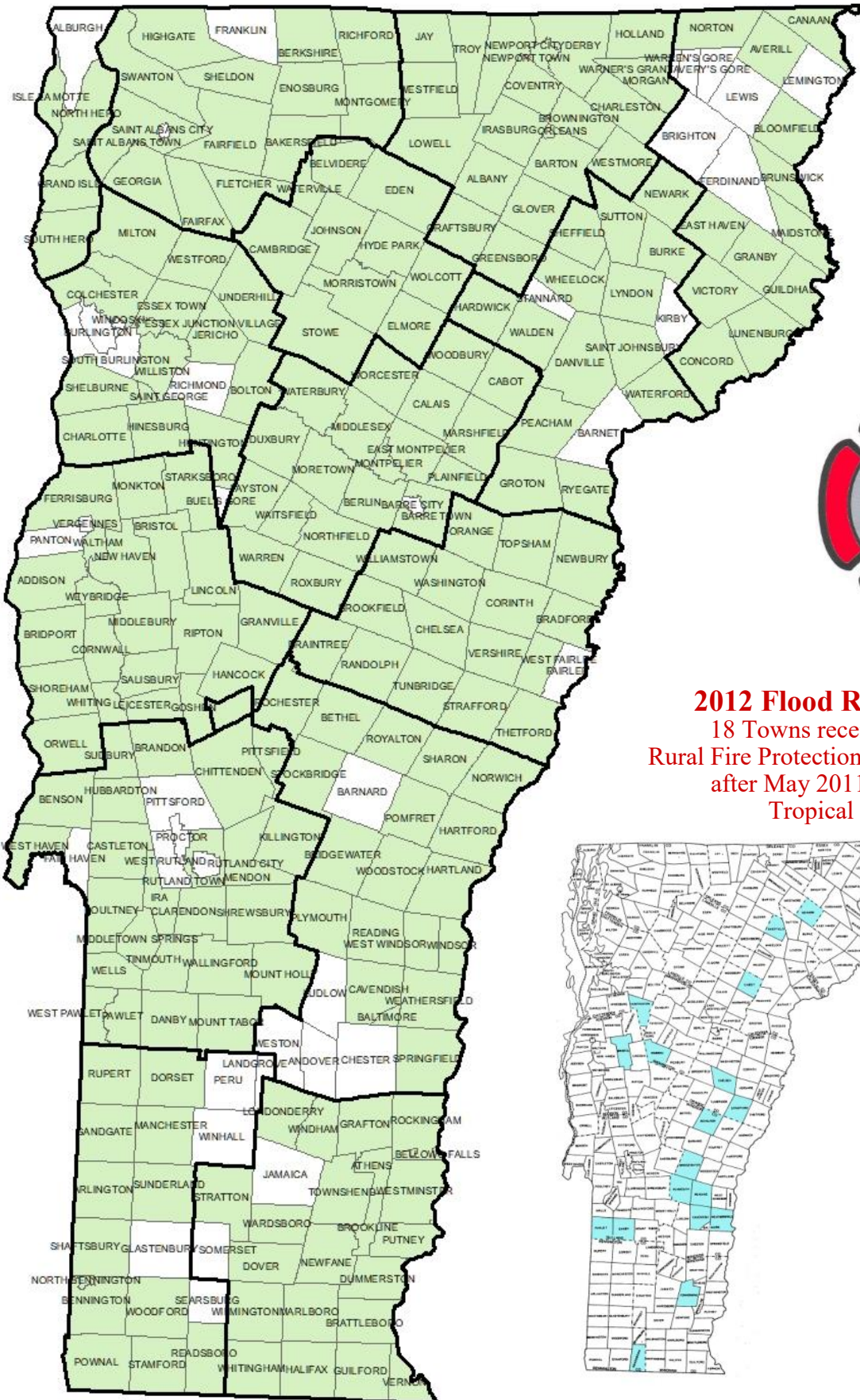

# 1998-2020 Rural Fire Protection Grant Program Recipients

215 Towns were awarded 966 dry hydrant grants up to \$10,000 totaling over \$2M funded by Vermont Legislative Appropriations through the Department of Public Safety

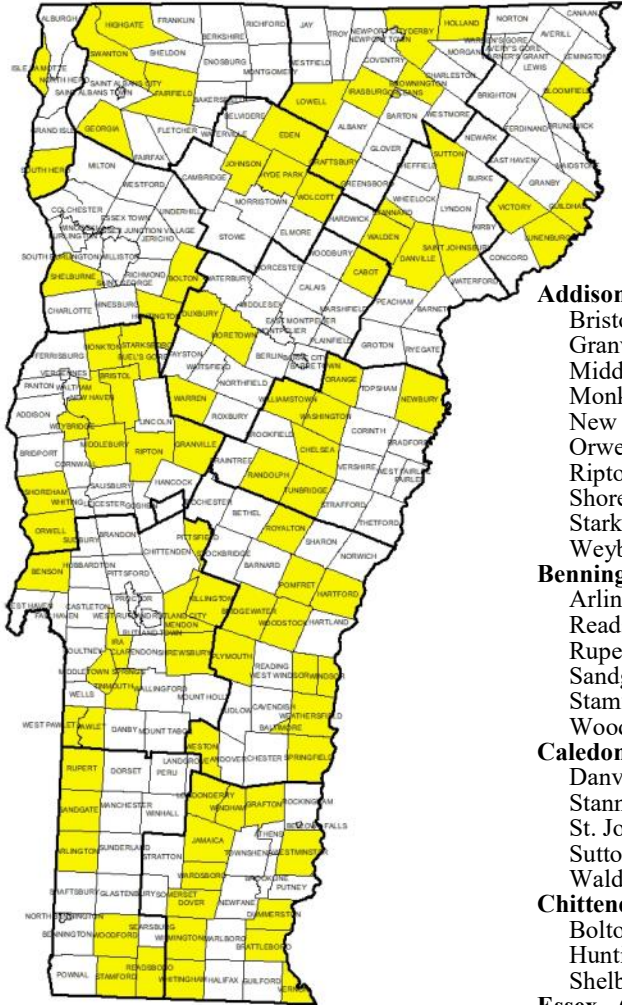

On June 18th Townshend Volunteer Fire Department installed a new dry hydrant in a large pond located at 2455 Windham Hill Road. With a grant from VT Agency of Conservation District and the help of Troy Dare, Donald Gould Excavating, Skip Woodruff and several TVFD members. The new installation was completed. The new hydrant will serve many residential locations in West Townshend and surrounding towns. Residents in the near vicinity could contact their insurance company for a possible discount.

**West Pawlet Fire Department**

West Pawlet Vol. Fire Department in conjunction with a grant from Vermont Rural Fire Protection Task Force under the Vermont Association of Conservation District has installed a dry hydrant/tank storage system at Loomis trucking on Rt149. This dry hydrant system will supply over 1000 gallons of water per minute to residential/commercial property in this area. This brook/tank regeneration system is the first in our district. It is a 1600 gallon tank with 6" permanent suction line. The tank system uses brook water from Bullfrog hollow.
