Spring / Summer of 2020

- Some Centers Didn't Finish Recruitment Last Year
- Student Triage Spring 2020/Scheduling Delayed/Rushed
 Scheduling
- Enrollment Drops at start of school year/Attrition
 Rates/Required Classes Failures
- Days in session or times of day, created hassles for students
- Half Day Programs Parents send to just one school to limit exposure

Spring of 2021 for Fall of 2021

- Decrease of Applications Gathered date over the last couple of weeks
- Remote Recruitment Is Just Not The Same
- Enrollment is Preceded by Outreach and Recruitment which relegated to a variety of remote activities
- No in person visits or presentations at sending schools

Fall of 2021 through Fall 2025

- A Little Different Story for Each Center Fickleness 6 Semester Avg.
 Rising and Falling/Replacing Low Number with High Number
- First post COVID Recruitment Season will be Spring of 2022 for Enrollment Fall of 2022
- Six semesters from October 2022 will fully purge the COVID impacted enrollments
- October 2024 could be the lowest FTE full burden of COVID enrollment
- Decrease in participation has placed certain programs in jeopardy due to lower enrollment
- VT CTE Funding, unlike the rest of the system, is dependent on student enrollment. Arguably VT CTE are the most impacted institutions in the State of Vermont.

Solutions

Solutions are limited

- FTE Hold Harmless (Ghost Students) or Financial Relief
 Independent of Passing on Cost
- Reduce Staffing/Programming is not desirable when our state needs CTE the most given the states workforce shortage
 - Starts next year for some centers
- Pass On Increased Costs to Sending Schools but this creates a barrier which is already there
- Ramp Up Funding System Change
- Use of Covid Relief Funds
