AUTHORIZATION LANGUAGE

Rental Assistance: \$25 billion is provided for emergency rental assistance through the Treasury Department. Vermont will receive the \$200 million small state minimum. There is less flexibility compared to the Coronavirus Relief Funding. 90% of funding must go to housing expenses such as rent or utility payments, or arrearages, and 10% may be used for provide case management services. Households must have an income of 80% AMI or lower and be experiencing financial

hardship due to COVID-19, with prioritization for households either experiencing unemployment or with incomes below 50% AMI. The funds are available through 12/31/2021.

Eviction Moratorium: The federal eviction moratorium put in place by the CDC has been extended through January 31, 2021. State and local moratoria are not affected by this change.

Coronavirus Relief Funds: The deadline to spend any remaining money from the Coronavirus Relief Fund has been extended to December 31, 2021.

Community Development Financial Institutions: An additional \$3 billion is provided to the CDFI Fund to expand their activities to respond to the COVID19 pandemic. The formula for distribution has not been determined. A new \$9 billion Emergency Capital Investment Program is also created.

Continuum of Care Funding Renewal: The bill renews funding for grantees who received CoC funding in FY2019, rather than having to compete for funds through a NOFA

New Market Tax Credit: The bill extends the annual \$5 billion allocations of the New Markets Tax Credit for years 2021 through 2025. The provision also extends through 2030 the carryover period for unused New Markets Tax Credits.

4% Low-Income Housing Tax Credit: The bill provides a permanent 4 percent rate floor for calculating credits related to certain acquisitions and housing bond-financed developments for purposes of the low-income housing credit. This will enable the construction of 130,000 affordable rental homes nationally between now and 2030, including hundreds in Vermont.

Weatherization: The bill provides increased investment nationwide, including a pilot neighborhood weatherization program, and calls for increased collaboration among federal funding streams.
