Attached, please find additional information the Committee asked for in Friday's Testimony by Deputy Commissioner Tricia Tyo and Heidi Moreau. The attached provides a timeline of the pandemic benefits provided for 3SquaresVT and Reach Up (RU), a case study comparing prepandemic vs. pandemic benefits, and overview of federal income applicable to ESD customers.

Additionally, the data below accompanies the timeline to offer further detail.

### • Emergency Maximum Allotment

Over \$45m issued. Households already at the maximum level received \$95 in max allotment benefits. \$95 is also the minimum benefit.

# • 15% increase to Thrifty Food Plan Table

o Approximately \$1.8 million in additional benefits per month.

#### • Pandemic EBT

- 2019/2020 school year: \$15m issued to 25,000 households with almost 39,000 children at a benefit of \$387/child.
- 2020/2021 school year: \$15m issued through February to 25,000 households with almost 39,000 children. Benefit amount varies based on whether child is attending in-person, remote, or hybrid learning. Benefit run for March-June scheduled for July 2021.
- Summer: Benefits for families normally receiving free/reduced price meals and SNAP households with children under the age of 6 at \$375/child. State plan still being developed. Issuance between July 2021-September 2021. Summer 2021: benefit expected to be \$375/family for school children and child care age children.
- 2021/2022 school year: Food benefits for families normally receiving free or reduced lunch. FNS has stated a benefit will be available for the 2021/2022 school year and summer 2022. No eligibility guidelines have been provided.

#### 3SquaresVT cash benefits

22 505 households received \$286/household.

## • RU cash benefit

- November 2020: Each family received \$432 for a total of \$1.3m.
- o December 2020: Each family received \$391 for a total of \$1.3m.
- August 2021: Estimated to be \$230/child enrolled in Reach Up for a total of \$1.6m.
- o *TBD per H.315*: Per legislation, \$1.3m to be distributed in a manner similar to earlier one-time benefit checks.

#### • RU Rental Assistance Program:

Renters have rent paid directly to property owners, helping RU families keep their full RU grant for the duration of the program. Rent ranges from ~\$150/month to \$1000/month. Program uses ERAP funds and is ongoing through at least March 2022.
