1	TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

2	The Committee on Natural Resources, Fish, and Wildlife to which was
3	referred Senate Bill No. 101 entitled "An act relating to promoting housing
4	choice and opportunity in smart growth areas" respectfully reports that it has
5	considered the same and recommends that the House propose to the Senate that
6	the bill be in Sec. 2, 24 V.S.A. § 4307, by striking it out in its entirety and
7	inserting in lieu thereof the following:
8	Sec. 2. 24 V.S.A. § 4307 is added to read:
9	§ 4307. MUNICIPAL BYLAW MODERNIZATION GRANTS
10	(a) There is created Municipal Bylaw Modernization Grants to assist
11	municipalities in updating their land use and development bylaws. Bylaws
12	updated under this section shall increase housing choice, affordability, and
13	opportunity in smart growth areas. The Grants shall be funded by monies
14	allocated from the municipality allocation of the Municipal and Regional
15	Planning Funds established in subdivision 4306 (a)(3)(C) of this title and any
16	other monies appropriated for this purpose.
17	(b) Disbursement to municipalities shall be administered by the
18	Department of Housing and Community Development through a competitive
19	process providing the opportunity for all regions and any eligible municipality
20	to compete regardless of size.

1	(c) Funds may be disbursed by the Department in installments to ensure the
2	municipal bylaw updates meet the goals of this section and may include a final
3	bonus payment to a municipal housing commission to support bylaw
4	implementation.
5	(d) Funding may be used for mapping, the cost of regional planning
6	commission staff or consultant time, carrying out the provisions of
7	subchapters 5 through 10 of this chapter, and any other purpose approved by
8	the Department.
9	(e) These funds shall be used to assist municipalities in the adoption of
10	bylaws that support a neighborhood development pattern that is pedestrian
11	oriented and consistent with smart growth principles established in
12	section 2791 of this title. The municipality shall commit to adopting bylaws
13	that increase housing choice, affordability, and opportunity in smart growth
14	areas that are located outside important natural resource areas and are located
15	outside identified flood hazard areas and river corridors or are suitable for infill
16	development as defined in § 29-201 of the Vermont Flood Hazard Area and
17	River Corridor Rule.
18	(f) To receive a grant, the municipality shall:
19	(1) identify any municipal water supply and wastewater disposal
20	capacity, opportunities, and constraints within mapped service areas in both
21	traditional water and wastewater systems and smaller scale municipal systems,

1	including soil-based wastewater treatment and decentralized water and
2	wastewater systems;
3	(2) allow duplexes within smart growth areas to the same extent that
4	single-family dwellings are allowed;
5	(3) require parking waiver provisions in appropriate smart growth areas
6	and situations;
7	(4) review and modify street standards that implement the complete
8	streets principles as described in 19 V.S.A. § 309d and that are oriented to
9	pedestrians;
10	(5) adopt dimensional, use, parking, and other standards that allow
11	compact neighborhood form and support walkable lot and unit density, which
12	may be achieved with a standard allowing at least four units per acre with site
13	and building design standards or minimum lot sizes of at least one-quarter of
14	an acre or by other means established in guidelines issued by the Department;
15	<u>and</u>
16	(6) demonstrate how the bylaws support implementation of the housing
17	element of its municipal plan as provided in 24 V.S.A. § 4382(a)(10) related to
18	addressing lower and moderate-income housing needs.
19	(g) On or before September 1, 2021, the Department shall adopt guidelines
20	to assist municipalities applying for grants under this section.
