Distributor



Material Processor



- Collects/processes sorted containers
- Pays redemption centers 8 cents per container



- Sells container to retail
- Collects 5 cents per container
- Pays material processor



 Collects unclaimed deposits




Retailer



- Sells container to customer
- Collects 5 cents per container

Customer





Redemption Center/Retailer



- Pays customer 5 cents per container
- Sorts empty containers for pickup

50 Years of Success for Vermont's Environment

- Consistently supported by large majorities of Vermonters
- Roughly 500 tons of recyclable materials taken out of the solid waste stream
- Clean stream of recyclables
- Model for responsible corporate behavior
- Putney Rd has operated in Brattleboro for over 30 years
- Build on our strengths, not our weaknesses



Single-stream and the Demise of Recycling



- More material in Recycling Bins
- Less material actually getting recycled
- Closure of the Chinese Market (2019)
- Chittenden Solid Waste glass scandal
- Redemption provides the single best stream of recyclables to the market.

Keeping Tons of Recyclables out of Wyndham Solid Waste



House Bill 175

- Increases the scope of the Bottle Bill to include:
 - Wine
 - Bottled Water
 - Juice and Sports Drinks
- Increases the deposit from \$0.05 to \$0.10.
 - Provides more incentive for consumers to return their redeemables so fewer get thrown away
- Increases the handling fee on "sorted" containers by half of a penny.
