8	entirety and relettering the remaining subsection to be alphabetically correct.
9	Second: In Sec. 14, environmental review board positions; appropriation, in
10	subsection (b), by striking out " <u>\$300,000.00</u> " and inserting " <u>\$384,000.00</u> "
11	Third: By striking out Sec. 17, report; environmental review board, in its
12	entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
13	Sec. 17. REPORT; ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW BOARD
14	(a) On or before December 31, 2023, the Chair of the Environmental
15	Review Board shall report to the House Committees on Natural Resources,
16	Fish, and Wildlife and on Ways and Means and the Senate Committees on
17	Finance and on Natural Resources and Energy on necessary updates to the
18	Act 250 program.

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1	(b) The report shall include:
2	(1) how to transition to a system in which Act 250 jurisdiction is based
3	on location, which shall encourage development in appropriate locations and
4	protect natural resources of statewide significance, including biodiversity;
5	(2) how to use the Capability and Development Plan to meet the
6	statewide planning goals;
7	(3) an assessment of the current level of staffing of the Board and
8	District Commissions, including whether there should be a district coordinator
9	located in every district;
10	(4) whether the permit fees are sufficient to cover the costs of the
11	program and, if not, a recommendation for a source of revenue to supplement
12	the fees;
13	(5) whether the permit fees are effective in providing appropriate
14	incentives; and
15	(6) whether the Board should be able to assess their costs on applicants.
