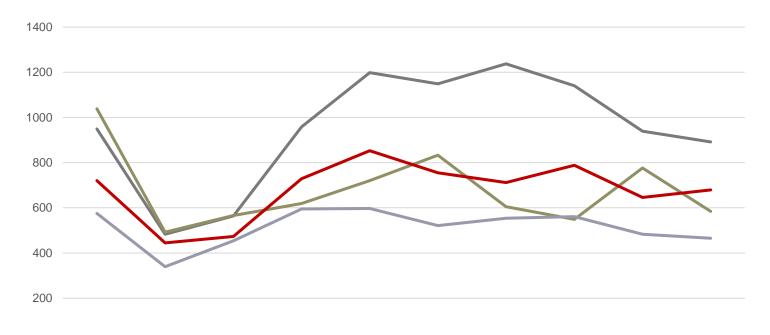
Statistical Report:

- The Judiciary's FY20 Annual Statistical Report is different from prior years' reports.
- This is principally because the case-level data on which the analysis depends was not available in all cases.
- This is due to the phased transition of the trial courts from the Judiciary's legacy case management system (VTADS) to its Next-Generation Case Management System (Odyssey), which occurred between June 2019 and February 2021.



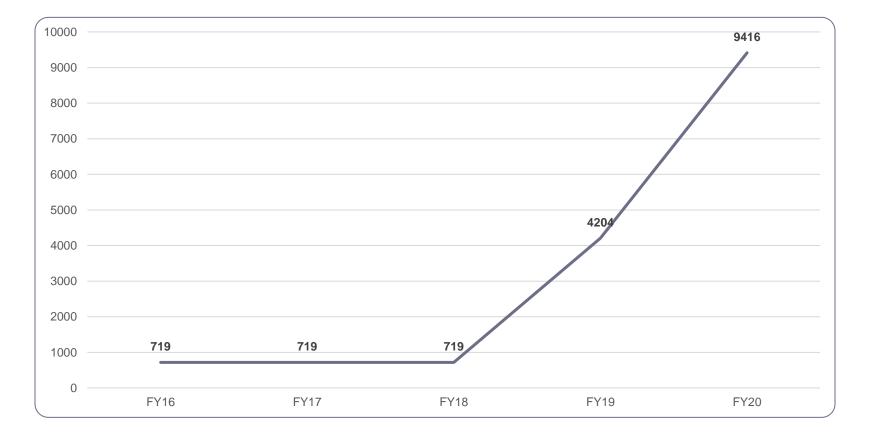
Statistical Trends:

Criminal, Civil, Family/Juvenile, and Probate Cases Filed, March 2020 - December 2020



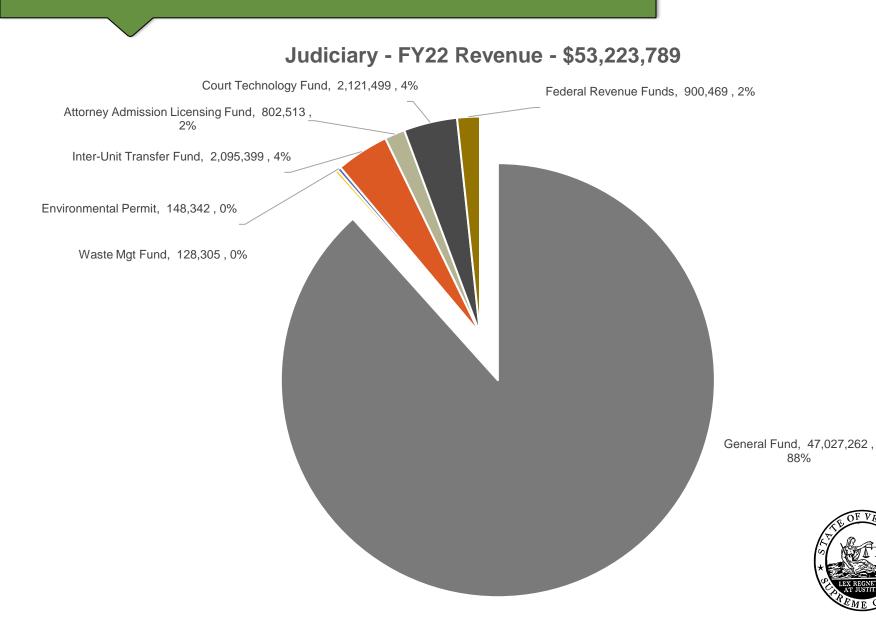

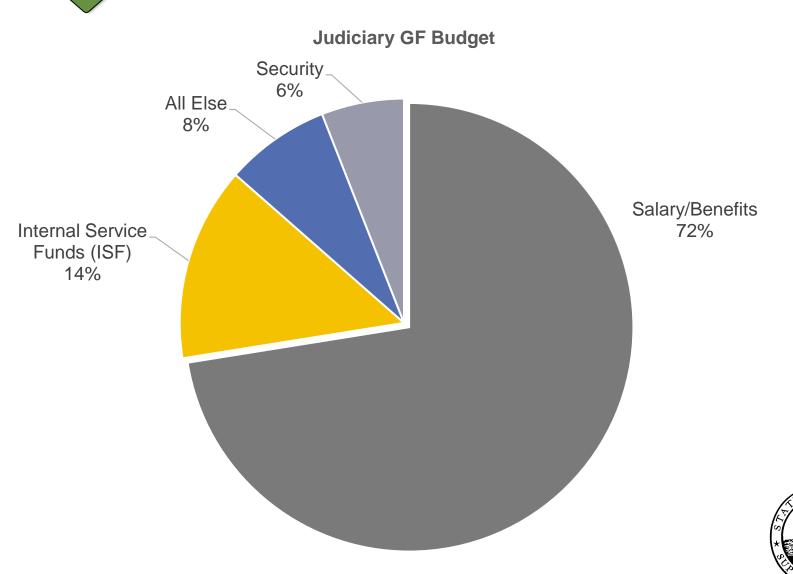

 - VLRB decision

 - Sheriff Increase
 - \$2,360,564 5% increase



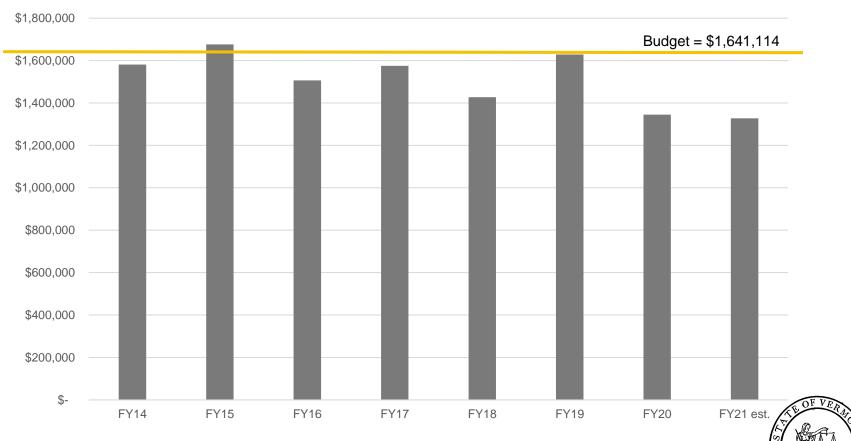
VLRB Decision

- No definition of "temporary" employment
- VT Labor Relations Board determined the 2 years at half time should be the maximum limit for "temporary"
- Eight staff identified to convert to limited service
 - 4 retired state employees
 - 6 working fewer than 30 hours per week
- Negotiating with VSEA on transition plan
- Judiciary will absorb FY21 costs and use unfilled CRF limited service position numbers
- Proposal is for \$250,000 base funding to support these 8 positions.

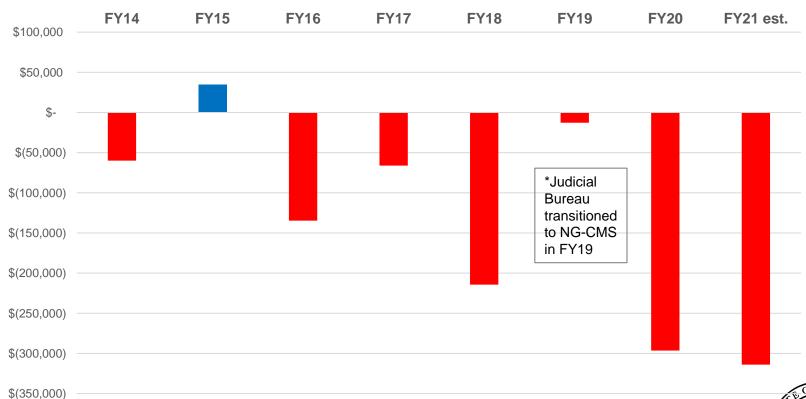


Tech Fund Revenue Decreases

Tech Fund Revenue



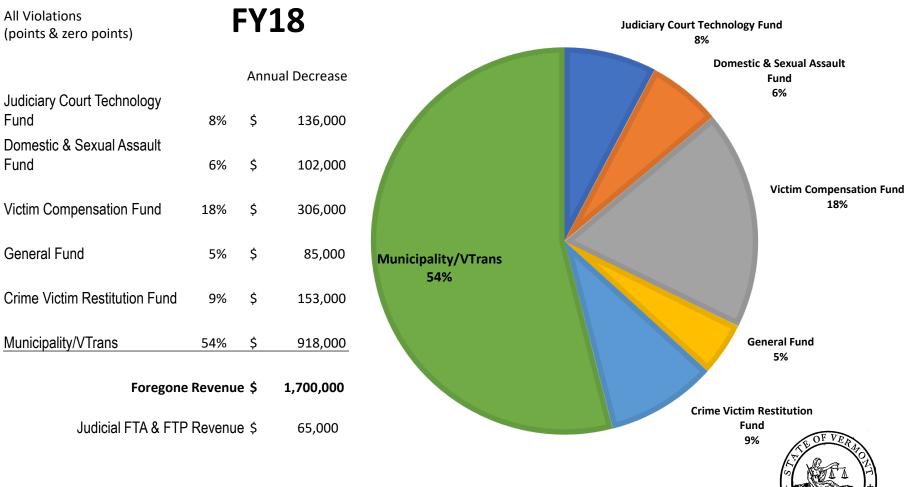

Security Positions

Two Security Positions

- Network of courthouse security is understaffed
- Washington Criminal staff increased by 2 just to maintain operations
- Costello staff using temporary staff that need to convert to limited service (VLRB Decision)
- Windham has no law enforcement presence





Increase to security hourly rates needed:

- Sheriffs are experiencing recruitment problems
- Reduced hours in Bennington Civil to afford rate increase
- Judicial rates range from \$29 to \$33 per hour
- BGS rates start at \$50 per hour
- Roads contracts can be \$70 to \$90 per hour
