12	(a) The Legislative Advisory Committee on the State House is created.
13	(b) The Committee shall be composed of 13 12 members:
14	(1) four three members of the House of Representatives, appointed
15	biennially by the Speaker of the House;
16	(2) four three members of the Senate, appointed biennially by the
17	Committee on Committees;
18	(3) the Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Friends of the Vermont
19	State House;
20	(4) the Director of the Vermont Historical Society;
21	(5) the Director of the Vermont Council on the Arts Council;

1	(6) the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services or designee;
2	<mark>and</mark>
3	(7) the Sergeant at Arms; and
4	(8) the State Curator.
5	(c) The Committee shall biennially elect a chair from among its legislative
6	members. A quorum shall consist of seven members.
7	(d) The Committee shall meet at the State House at least one time when the
8	General Assembly is in session and at least one time when. When the General
9	Assembly is not in session or at the call of the Chair, the Committee shall mee
10	at least one time, but the Committee and any subcommittees shall not
11	cumulatively meet more than six times per year; provided, however, that the
12	Committee and any subcommittees of the Committee may meet more often
13	with the approval of the Speaker of the House and the President Pro Tempore
14	of the Senate. The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services shall
15	keep minutes of the meetings and maintain a file thereof.
16	(e) The Committee shall have the assistance of the Office of Legislative
17	Counsel and the Office of Legislative Operations.
18	(f) A member of the Committee shall not vote on a matter under
19	consideration by the Committee regarding any activities or duties the member
20	is responsible for discharging.

1	§ 652. PER DIEM AND EXPENSES; LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS
2	For meetings held during adjournment of the General Assembly, the
3	legislative members of the Committee shall be entitled to per diem
4	compensation and expense reimbursement as provided in subsection 406(a) of
5	this title.
6	§ 653. FUNCTIONS
7	(a)(1) The Legislative Advisory Committee on the State House shall be
8	consulted on:
9	(1) review, coordinate, and make recommendations on all activities
10	relating to the acquisition collections and care of paintings and art, historic
11	artifacts, and furnishings, and the refurbishing, renovation, preservation, and
12	expansion of the building and its interior-; and
13	(2) The Legislative Advisory Committee on the State House shall
14	develop approve a plan for the acquisition or commission of artwork
15	collections policy for the State House collection that represents Vermont's
16	diverse people and history, including diversity of gender, race, ethnicity,
17	sexuality, and disability status, as developed by the State Curator pursuant to
18	29 V.S.A. § 154a(c).
19	(b) The Sergeant at Arms and the Commissioner of Buildings and General
20	Services, in discharging responsibilities under subdivision 62(a)(6) of this title
21	and 29 V.S.A. §§ 154(a) and 154a, respectively, shall consider the

1	recommendations of the Committee. The Committee's recommendations shall	
2	be advisory only.

5	(a) The Sergeant at Arms shall:	
6	(1) execute orders of either house, the Joint Legislative Management	
7	Committee, the Committee on Joint Rules, or the House or Senate Committee	
8	on Rules;	
9	(2) maintain order among spectators and take measures to prevent	
10	interruption of either house or any committee thereof;	
11	(3) arrange for special meetings and conferences at the State House;

7	(c) The Sergeant at Arms shall not be responsible for:
8	(1) structural repairs, or capital improvements, to the or building;
9	(2) the maintenance for of the State House building (as the term
10	maintenance is defined in 29 V.S.A. § 159);
11	(3) curating the historic State House and its collections; or for
12	(4) the use, upkeep, or maintenance of the State House grounds.
13	(d) The Sergeant at Arms and employees of the Sergeant at Arms shall seek
14	guidance from and operate in accordance with policies adopted by the Joint
15	Legislative Management Committee.

18	(a) Creation. The position of State Curator is created within the
19	Department of Buildings and General Services.
20	(b) Duties. The State Curator's responsibilities shall include:

1	(1) oversight of the general historic preservation of the State House,
2	including maintaining the historical integrity of the State House and works of
3	art in the State House;
4	(2) interpretation of the State House to the visiting public through
5	exhibits, publications, and tours, and other means of communication; and
6	(3) acquisition, management, and care of State collections of art and,
7	historic artifacts, and furnishings, provided that any works of art all items
8	obtained for the State House are acquired pursuant to the requirements of

17	ensures that the acquisition of art, historic artifacts, and furnishings, and the
18	commissioning of art and furnishings, for the State House reflects Vermont's
19	diverse people and history, including a diversity of race, ethnicity, sex, gender
20	identity, sexual orientation, and disability status, and a diversity of artistic
21	media and artists, and celebrates the natural history of the State, and the

1	diversity of the people and stories of Vermont throughout the history of the
2	State. <u>Upon approval of the Legislative Advisory Committee on the State</u>
3	House pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 653, the State Curator shall adopt the collections
4	policy.
5	(d) Interpretive plan. In coordination with the Friends of the Vermont State
6	House and the Vermont Historical Society, the State Curator shall create an
7	interpretive plan that tells the stories of the State House art collection through
8	accessible written, multimedia, and oral means. The plan shall include
9	appropriate and inclusive training of State House volunteers and staff.
10	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATES
11	This act shall take effect on passage, except that:
12	(1) all legislator members serving on the Legislative Advisory
13	Committee on the State House as of the date of enactment of this act shall
14	remain on the Committee through the end of the 2021–2022 biennium; and
15	(2) the Committee shall not approve a collections policy pursuant to
16	2 V.S.A. § 653(a)(2) until the legislator members of the Legislative Advisory
17	Committee on the State House for the 2023–2024 biennium have been
18	appointed.
