- The Committee on Commerce and Economic Development to which was referred House Bill No. 703 entitled "An act relating to promoting workforce development" respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the report of the Committee on Ways and Means be amended by striking out Sec. 6, justice-involved individuals; workforce development; pilot program, in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof a new Sec. 6 to read as follows:
- Sec. 6. INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS; WORKFORCE

DEVELOPMENT; PILOT PROGRAM

- (a) Purpose. The purpose of this section is to facilitate the education and vocational training of incarcerated individuals so that they have a greater likelihood of obtaining gainful employment and positively contribute to society upon reintegration into the community.
- (b) Policy; appropriations.
- (1)(A) In fiscal year 2023, the amount of \$420,000.00 of the funds appropriated to the Department of Corrections shall be allocated [to establish a pilot program] to address education and vocational enhancement needs. These funds shall not be allocated from any amounts budgeted for Justice Reinvestment II initiatives.

1	(B) The Department shall use the funds allocated for the development			
2	of education and vocational training for incarcerated individuals residing in a			
3	correctional facility prior to community reintegration. The Department may			
4	allocate the funds over three years, consistent with the following:			
5	(i) \$270,000.00 for transition development, including equipment			
6	and mobile labs in one or more sites;			
7	(ii) \$100,000.00 for training partner support; and			
8	(iii) \$50,000.00 for curriculum development.			
9	(2) In fiscal year 2023, the amount of \$300,000.00 is appropriated from			
10	the General Fund to the Department of Corrections, which may be allocated			
11	over not more than three years, to establish a community-based pilot reentry			
12	program at the Chittenden Regional Correctional Facility. The Department			
13	shall designate a service provider to administer the pilot program's goals to:			
14	(A) provide continuity of services for incarcerated individuals;			
15	(B) expand current employment readiness programs within the			
16	facility by building pathways for coordinated transition to employment;			
17	(C) focus on the first six months after individuals are released from			
18	the facility;			
19	(D) coordinate with local community resources, parole and probation			
20	offices, and other supports to ensure successful transition into the community;			
21	(E) assist individuals in successfully transitioning into new jobs; and			

1	(F) work with employers to support successful hiring and best	
2	practices to support incarcerated individuals.	
3	(c) Report. On or before January 15, 2023, the Department of Corrections	
4	shall create and submit a report on Workforce and Education Training	
5	Programs in Correctional Facilities to the Joint Legislative Justice Oversight	
6	Committee; the House Committees on Corrections and Institutions and on	
7	Commerce and Economic Development; and the Senate Committees on	
8	Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs and on Judiciary. The	
9	report shall:	
10	(1) identify program design, logistical needs, and policy changes to	
11	current Department of Corrections facility-based training and educational	
12	programs necessary to successfully support incarcerated individuals'	
13	reintegration into their communities, including changes to programs that bette	
14	support individuals' skill development, knowledge, and support needed to	
15	qualify and secure a position in a critical occupation in Vermont;	
16	(2) identify disparities of outcomes and recommend solutions for	
17	incarcerated BIPOC individuals concerning facility-based training, educationa	
18	programming, and successful community reintegration;	
19	(3) provide an update on the Department of Corrections' use of	
20	education and vocational enhancement funding in fiscal year 2023; and	

1	(4) provide recommendations on what aspects of the pilot program		
2	should be replicated in other correctional facilities in Vermont; and		
3	(5) provide recommended legislation for the continuation of the pilot		
4	program or any changes.
