
Enhanced 911 Board - Overview

- Defined statute since 1994 as the single governmental agency responsible for statewide enhanced 911
- Nine-member Board, appointed by the Governor, representing state, local and county law enforcement, emergency medical services, fire service, municipalities, and the public
- ► Ten Board staff members responsible for IT Management, GIS & Database Administration, Training & Communications

Vermont 911 System Stats - 2020

- Total 911 Calls Received 209,990 (up 384 or .18 % from 209,606 in 2019)
- Total Cellular 911 Calls Received 148,391
 (approximately 71% of total, up from 69% in 2019)
- Average Time to Answer 00:05
- Average Call Time 02:02
- Total Text-to-911 Received 340 (down 72 or 21% from 412 in 2019)

Current Key Initiatives

Successful Implementation of INdigital NG911 System -October 2020

FY 21 Budget Deficit

- Projecting a deficit in the Enhanced 911 Special Fund of 575K to at least 1M dollars by the end of FY21 as a result of ongoing and unresolved revenue shortfalls in the Vermont Universal Service Fund.
- ► In FY20 the 911 program did not receive approximately 672K of the \$4.9 million appropriation
- In FY21 the 911 program has received approximately 400-532K less than would be expected by this time of the \$4.8 million appropriation
