2 Representative Shaw of Pittsford moves that the bill be amended by striking
3 out all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 Sec. 1. REPEAL OF CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE OFFENSES; ANNUAL
5 REPORT

6 (a) The Executive Director of Racial Equity, the Commissioner of Motor
7 Vehicles, and the Commissioner of Public Safety jointly shall examine the
8 motor vehicle violations for the purpose of making annual recommendations
9 whether or not statutes should be repealed, modified, or limited to secondary
10 enforcement. The following statutes shall be addressed in the first report:

11 (1) 23 V.S.A. § 307 (failure to carry a registration certificate);

12 (2) 23 V.S.A. § 511(c) (failure to display registration sticker or failure to
13 display unobstructed license numbers);

14 (3) 23 V.S.A. § 512 (failure to display number plate on trailer or semi-
15 trailer);

16 (4) 23 V.S.A. § 615 (operation by an individual with a learner’s permit);

17 (5) 23 V.S.A. § 1023 (pedestrian-control signals);

18 (6) 23 V.S.A. §§ 1052 (crossing except at crosswalks), 1054

19 (pedestrians to use right half of crosswalks), 1055 (pedestrians on roadways),

20 1056 (highway solicitations), and 1058 (duties of pedestrians);

21 (7) 23 V.S.A. § 1125 (obstructing windshield or windows);

1 (8) 23 V.S.A. §§ 1134 (possession or consumption of alcohol or
2 cannabis by operator), 1134a (possession of consumption of alcohol or
3 cannabis by passenger) and 1134b(a) (using tobacco in a motor vehicle with
4 child present);

5 (9) 23 V.S.A. § 1221 (condition of vehicle);

6 (10) 23 V.S.A. §§ 1243 (headlights), 1244 (illumination required), 1245
7 (illumination required on motorcycles), 1248 (taillights), and 1249 (directional
8 signal lights); and

9 (11) 23 V.S.A. § 1259 (safety belts; persons 18 years of age or older).

10 (b) The Executive Director and Commissioners jointly shall report the
11 recommendations to the House and Senate Committees on Government
12 Operations, on Judiciary, and on Transportation not later than October 1, 2022,
13 and annually thereafter.

14 Sec. 2. SUNSET OF REPEAL OF CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE

15 OFFENSES; ANNUAL REPORT

16 Sec. 1 of this act shall be repealed on July 1, 2027.

17 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

18 This act shall take effect on passage.
