I am in favor of the draft map called the "minority alternate map" showing the new single member district to be Greensboro, Craftsbury, Albany, and Glover. The other map in consideration is one approved by the LAB, showing the new district as Greensboro, Craftsbury, Albany, Irasburg. From a Greensboro perspective, I feel Greensboro share more in common with Glover then Irasburg.

Our current 2 member representation is a cross county district hence Orleans/Caledonia covering the towns of Albany, Barton, Craftsbury, Glover, Greensboro, Sheffield, and Wheelock.
