

The goal is to have 4,287 residents per single-member House district.

CURRENT

Currently, the population numbers and % deviations per district are as follows, based on the census data:

- D1 has 4,402, with a +2.7% deviation
- D2 has 3,907, with a -8.9% deviation
- D3 has 3,875, with a -9.6% deviation

Windham-2-1	1	4,402	115	2.7%
Windham-2-2	1	3,907	-380	-8.9%
Windham-2-3	1	3,875	-412	-9.6%

PROPOSAL B (LAB Minority)

- D1 changes from 4,402 minus 334 = 4,068 = -5.4% deviation (-5.11%?)
- D2 changes from 3,907 plus 150 = 4,057 = -5.36% deviation
- D3 changes from 3,875 plus 184 = 4,059 = -5.32% deviation
- Total of 484 people move districts

TMMs:

- D1 loses 9
- D2 gains 1
- D3 gains 8

PROPOSAL C (BCA Proposal)

- D1 changes from 4,402 minus 176, minus 172 = 4,054 = -5.4% deviation
- D2 changes from 3,907 plus 172 = 4,079 = -4.8% deviation
- D3 changes from 3,875 plus 176 = 4,051 = -5.5% deviation
- Total of 348 people move districts
- District lines are difficult to articulate between proposed D1 and D2

TMMs:

- 1 TMMs move from D1 to D3
