


What is VHCURES:

• VHCURES is a research database. It is NOT a data set used by clinicians while providing medical care.

How does VHCURES work?



How data come into and out of VHCURES?



- S.285 Sec. 5. makes linking claims to a specific person more accurate.
 - O Vermont was one of the leaders in creating databases like VHCURES. Many states have since followed Vermont's lead.
 - o Because Vermont led the pack, it didn't know how data submission standards would cause problems.
 - Other states followed Vermont but when they created VHCURES-like all-payer claims databases they fixed the problem that S.285 Sec. 5 addresses.
 - Currently, linking claims, for example, where a person's name is spelled differently is a problem Sara Albert is assigned Claimant ID 2 and Sarah Albert is assigned Claimant ID 5 even though they are the same person.
 - o S.285 Sec. 5 allows linking claims to the right person Sara Albert and Sarah Albert both are assigned Claimant ID 2 since it is the same person.
 - S.285 Sec. 5 also would allow the integration the clinical records of Sarah Albert with her Claimant ID.
 - S.285 Sec. 5 does NOT change the fact that a person's identifying information always remains concealed to VHCURES users. Research using VHCURES will be more accurate and able to look at more topics relevant to health care reform.
- S.285 Sec. 5 changes how payers submit data to VHCURES.
- S.285 Sec. 5 changes what other data VHCURES can link to a Claimant ID.
- It does not change the data that the GMCB, the state, or authorized 3rd parties see.
