RUTLAND COUNTY Rutland Mental Health Services (RMHS)	Royce Street	6	Individuals with significant medical/health needs.

BENNINGTON COUNTY United Counseling Services (UCS)	Union Street	6 – TCR	No specific population. Crisis bed attached. Not handicap accessible, except for entrance and crisis bed.
	Autumn House	4 – Level III	Older population and medically frail. Handicap accessible.
	Gatling House	4 – Level III	No specific population. Currently serves people who can independently navigate the community. Handicap accessible.
ORANGE COUNTY Upper Valley Services (UVS)	Pleasant Street	3	Currently serves people who use wheelchairs.
WASHINGTON COUNTY Washington County Mental Health Services (WCMH)	Arioli	6	Serves individuals who need some medical oversight, personal care and/or minimal behavioral issues. Handicap accessible.
	Hill Street	6	Serves individuals who need medical support. On-sight nursing daily. Extensive experience in end of life care and end-stage dementia support. Handicap accessible.
