FY18	45,000	22,491	300	133
FY19	30,000	30,000	175	115
FY20	18,000	9,772	104	23
FY21	15,000	1,460	100	26

Over the four-year period, USCRI lost 1/3 of staffing capacity due to loss of funding and closed down the office in Rutland after resettling 3 Syrian families.

- COVID-19 outbreaks across five refugee groups




CRF FUNDING IMPACT


