Subject: Research Regarding Domestic Violence and Firearms and Relevant State Laws

Dear Representative Grad,

Thank you for the House Judiciary's continued work on H. 133. We believe that this statute will clarify an important form of available relief for victims of domestic violence seeking an emergency Relief from Abuse (RFA) order.

As the Network has highlighted in previous testimony, research indicates that firearms are a leading risk factor in intimate-partner homicide. In addition, researchers have worked to quantify the impact of state laws requiring firearms relinquishment or non-possession in domestic violence cases (both civil and criminal). Please find attached the following documents for the committee's information and consideration:
