9	Subchapter 2. Division of Racial Justice Statistics
10	§ 5011. DIVISION OF RACIAL JUSTICE STATISTICS; CREATION;
11	PURPOSE
12	(a) Creation. There is created within the Office of Racial Equity the
13	Division of Racial Justice Statistics to collect and analyze data related to
14	systemic racial bias and disparities within the criminal and juvenile justice
15	systems.
16	(b) Purpose. The mission of the Division is to collect and analyze data
17	relating to racial disparities with the intent to center racial equity throughout
18	these efforts. The purpose of the Division is to create, promote, and advance a
19	system and structure that provides access to appropriate data and information,
20	ensuring that privacy interests are protected and principles of transparency and
21	accountability are clearly expressed. The data are to be used to inform policy

1	decisions that work toward the amelioration of racial disparities across various
2	systems of State government.
3	<u>§ 5012. DUTIES</u>
4	(a) The Division shall have the following duties:
5	(1) Work collaboratively with, and have the assistance of, all State and
6	local agencies and departments for purposes of collecting all data related to
7	systemic racial bias and disparities within the criminal and juvenile justice
8	systems.
9	(2) Collect and analyze the data related to systemic racial bias and
10	disparities within the criminal and juvenile justice systems.
11	(3) Conduct justice information sharing gap analyses.
12	(4) Maintain an inventory of justice technology assets and a data
13	dictionary to identify elements and structure of databases and relationships, if
14	any, to other databases.
15	(5) Develop a justice technology strategic plan, which shall be updated
16	annually. The justice technology strategic plan shall include identification and
17	prioritization of data needs and requirements to fulfill new or emerging data
18	research proposals or operational enhancements.
19	(6) Make recommendations for designing and implementing interfaces
20	and other technology solutions to address the needs identified in the justice
21	technology strategic plan.

(6) Develop interagency agreements and memorandums of
understanding for data sharing and publish public use files.
(7) Report its data, analyses, and recommendations to the Racial Justice
Statistics Advisory Council on a monthly basis.
(b)(9) On or before January 15, 2023, and annually thereafter, the Division
shall report its data, analyses, and recommendations to the House and Senate
Committees on Judiciary and on Government Operations.
(b) To carry out its duties under this subchapter, the Division shall adopt
procedural and substantive rules in accordance with the provisions of 3 V.S.A.
chapter 25.
<u>§ 5013. DATA GOVERNANCE</u>
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 (a) Data collection. In consultation with the Racial Disparities in the Criminal and Juvenile Justice Systems Advisory Panel and the Racial Justice Statistics Advisory Council, the Division shall establish, by rule, the data to be collected to carry out the duties of this subchapter. (1) Data collected pursuant to this subchapter are not public records subject to Vermont's Public Records Law, 1 V.S.A. § 315 et seq, and data release shall be governed exclusively by data sharing agreements or

1	shall be kept confidential to the extent required by law. A State or local agency
2	or department that transmits data or records to the Division shall be the sole
3	records custodian for purposes of responding to requests for the data or
4	records. The Division shall direct any request for these data or records to the
5	transmitting agency or department for response.
6	(2) The Division shall be granted access to the data of any State agency
7	or department it designates, by rule, as identify which State agencies or
8	departments possess the data necessary for the Division to perform the
9	requirements and objectives of this subchapter. An agency or department
10	identified pursuant to this subdivision shall, upon request, provide the Division
11	with any data that the Division [requests] [determines is relevant to its purpose
12	under subsection 5011(b) of this title]. The Division may access the data of a
13	non-State entity pursuant to a data sharing agreement or memorandum of
14	understanding with the entity.
15	(3) The Division shall work with the Agency of Digital Services on the
16	collection and retention of data, data governance, and data security issues and
17	may contract with a third party vendor for the storage, management, and
18	retention of the data if so recommended by the Agency of Digital Services.
19	The Division shall, pursuant to 3 V.S.A. § 218, establish, maintain, and
20	implement an active and continuing management program for its records and
21	information, including data, with support and services provided by the

1	Vermont State Archives and Records Administration pursuant to 3 V.S.A. §
2	117 and the Agency of Digital Services pursuant to 3 V.S.A. § 3301.
3	(4) The Division shall consult with the Racial Disparities in the Criminal
4	and Juvenile Justice Systems Advisory Panel and the Racial Justice Statistics
5	Advisory Council when establishing which data shall be collected pursuant to
6	this subchapter.
7	(b) Data analysis. The Division shall analyze the data collected pursuant to
8	this subchapter in order to:
9	(1) identify the stages of the criminal and juvenile justice systems at
10	which racial bias and disparities are most likely to occur;
11	(2) organize and synthesize the data in a cohesive and logical manner so
12	that it can be best presented and understood; and
13	(3) present the data to the Racial Justice Statistics Advisory Council as
14	required under this subchapter.
15	(c) Data governance policy. The Division shall develop and adopt a data
16	governance policy and shall establish:
17	(1) a system or systems to standardize the collection and retention of the
18	data collected pursuant to this subchapter; and
19	(2) methods to permit sharing and communication of the data between
20	the State agencies, local agencies, and external researchers, including the use
21	of data sharing agreements.

1	(d) Data retention. The Division shall recommend to State and local
2	agencies evidence-based practices and standards for the collection and
3	retention of racial justice data.
4	(e) Publicly available data.
5	(1) The Division shall maintain a public-facing website and dashboard
6	that maximizes the transparency of the Division's work and ensures the ability
7	of the public and historically impacted communities to review and understand
8	the data collected by the Division and its analyses.
9	(2) The Division shall develop public use data files.
10	§ 5014. RACIAL JUSTICE STATISTICS ADVISORY COUNCIL
11	(a) Creation. The Racial Justice Statistics Advisory Council is established.
12	The Council shall be organized and have the duties and responsibilities as
13	provided in this section. The Council shall have the administrative, legal, and
14	technical support of the Agency of Administration.
15	(b) Membership.
16	(1) Appointments. The Council shall consist of 48 20 members, as
17	<u>follows:</u>
18	(A) two members of the General Assembly, one to be appointed by
19	the Committee on Committees and one to be appointed by the Speaker of the
20	House;
21	(B) the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or designee;

6	(ii) Appointments made pursuant to this subdivision (N) shall be
7	made by the following entities, each of which shall appoint one member:
8	NAACP, Vermont Racial Justice Alliance, Migrant Justice, AALV Inc.,
9	Vermont Commission on Native American Affairs, and Outright Vermont.
10	(2) Qualifications. Members shall be drawn from diverse backgrounds
11	to represent the interests of communities of color and other historically
12	disadvantaged communities throughout the State and, to the extent possible,
13	have experience working to implement racial justice reform and represent
14	geographically diverse areas of the State.
15	(3) Terms. The term of each member shall be four years. As terms of
16	currently serving members expire, appointments of successors shall be in
17	accord with the provisions of this section. Appointments of members to fill
18	vacancies or expired terms shall be made by the authority that made the initial
19	appointment to the vacated or expired term. Members shall serve until their
20	successors are elected or appointed. Members shall serve not more than two
21	consecutive terms in any capacity.

1	(4) Chair and terms. Members of the Council shall elect by majority
2	vote the Chair of the Council. Members of the Council shall be appointed on
3	or before November 1, 2022 in order to prepare as they deem necessary for the
4	establishment of the Council, including the election of the Chair of the
5	Council. Terms of members shall officially begin on January 1, 2023.
6	(c) Duties. The Council shall have the following duties and
7	responsibilities:
8	(1) work with and assist the Director or designee to implement the
9	requirements of this subchapter;
10	(2) advise the Director to ensure ongoing compliance with the purpose
11	of this subchapter;
12	(3) evaluate the data and analyses received from the Division and make
13	recommendations to the Division as a result of the evaluations; and
14	(4) on or before January 15, 2023 and annually thereafter, report to the
15	House and Senate Committees on Judiciary and on Government Operations on:
16	(A) its findings regarding systemic racial bias and disparities within
17	the criminal and juvenile justice systems based upon the data and analyses the
18	Council receives from the Division pursuant to subdivision 5012(a)(8) of this

10	(a) First meeting. The first meeting of the Racial Justice Statistics
11	Advisory Council shall be called by the Director of Racial Equity or designee.
12	All subsequent meetings shall be called by the Chair.
13	(b) Staggered terms. Notwithstanding Sec. 1 of this act, the initial terms of
14	the Council members beginning on January 1, 2023 shall be as follows:
