Amber,

Apologies for any confusion. I believe my colleague was clarifying that our position on S.113 has not changed after additional testimony from DFR. Additionally, my testimony has not changed, and I don't have any new language to add. We supported the changes including the use of "proximate cause" and the mirroring of the test and criteria in S.113 with the Crawford test and standard, as cited in both verbal and written testimony in the <u>Senate Judiciary Committee</u> and the <u>House Judiciary Committee</u>. The Vermont Chamber, however, still has concerns as to whether or not insurance can be written for medical monitoring claims and our manufacturers. The insurance industry has weighed in and is opposed. The Department of Financial Regulation's "neutral position" lacked clarity on the insurance concerns. As such, the Vermont Chamber cannot support this bill until the insurance concerns are addressed.
